'Queen of Hearts' is a story of love and courage based on the exploits of Esther, an immigrant woman who was crowned queen of the Persian Empire. Written and directed by Shekinah Jacob, who has trained at the Royal Court Theatre and Goldsmiths in London, this modern take on the story resonates with current issues and politics in the world today. Shekinah is no stranger to CMC, being the daughter of former staff, Drs Isaac and Prasanna Jebaraj.

The choreography is by world renowned salsa maestro and dancer Richard David Tholloor who has won numerous world titles and holds a place in the Limca Book of World Records. The original music is a result of collaboration with some of the best musicians and artistes in Bangalore and Chennai.

### **Bridge House**

People come from all over India and beyond to the Department of Haematology, for stem cell transplant. After months of chemotherapy, followed by their transplant, our patients are discharged. They have to find accommodation outside the hospital for approximately two to three months. They have to attend hospital twice or thrice a week to give blood samples in the morning and return in the afternoon for a doctor's appointment. Ideally, they should live in a pollution-free environment, where they can exercise and rest.

In a year or two, the Department of Haematology will be moving to the New Hospital Campus at Kannigapuram. Our dream is to build Bridge House on this campus. It would provide accommodation at reasonable cost for both our private and general patients. It would be within walking distance of the Department, a place for ongoing holistic care in a wholesome and clean environment.
