## **CME Update on Fetal Growth Restriction**

A half-day CME update on 'Fetal Growth Restriction' was organised by the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology (OG), Unit IV, on 12th August, 2017. Fetal Growth Restriction is the leading cause of stillbirths globally, accounting for nearly 43% of the cases. The CME aimed at creating awareness about this preventable cause of perinatal mortality.

Dr Reeta Vijayaselvi, Associate Professor, OG, Unit IV, spoke on 'Risk assessment and prevention of recurrence'. Dr Anne George, Associate Professor, Department of Community Health, spoke on 'Diagnosis of Fetal Growth Restriction in low resource settings'.

Dr Liji Sarah David, Assistant Professor, OG, Unit IV, focused on 'The clinical management of pregnancies complicated by Fetal Growth Restriction', while Dr Mintoo Tegrestina, D M Fellow (Neonatology) spoke on 'Complications in a growth restricted neonate'.

A panel discussion based on clinical case scenarios was led by Dr Manisha Madhai Beck, Professor and Acting Head of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Unit IV. The CME, attended by over 70 delegates from in and around Vellore, ended with the Open House that witnessed active participation by the audience.
