State Level Workshop on 'Core Nursing Competencies in Disaster Management'

The awareness and the aftermath of Disaster among the public is overwhelming. The recent recurrent Manmade and Natural disasters have seen the involvement of health care team as a response in medical management and relief activities. It becomes important that the vital nurse's force have a significant role in disaster management both at community and within the hospitals. This workshop focuses on competency based directions based on ICN and WHO guidelines.

World Health Organization defines Disaster as "A serious disruption of the functioning of a community or a society causing widespread human, material, economic or environmental losses which exceed the ability of the affected community or society to cope using its own resources" (ISDR, 2004, p. 9;, 2007).

The ICN believes, "Nurses with their technical skills and knowledge of epidemiology, physiology, pharmacology, cultural-familial structures, and psychological issues can assist in disaster preparedness programs, as well as during disasters". The preparedness of the nurses needs to be competency based which is customized to the needs of India. The International Council of Nurses and the World Health Organization, in support of Member States and nurses, recognize the urgent **need for acceleration of efforts to build capacities of nurses at all levels** to safeguard population, limit injuries and deaths, maintain health system functioning and community well-being, in the midst of continued health threats and disasters.

There are well documented evidences demanding the need for qualified individuals to respond and participate in disaster preparedness and recovery activities. However, training is often

fragmented or not available. Over the last several years, organizations and groups have begun to address the issue by describing the role of responders and developing specialized education and training program. As the largest group of health care providers, nurses need to develop competence in disaster preparedness and response. Therefore, competency based disaster training is vital for all nurses. College of Nursing, CMC, Vellore being a WHO collaborative centre for Nursing and Midwifery development is planning for capacity building in disaster management among nursing fraternity. Hence a one day state level workshop on 'CORE NURSING COMPETENCIES IN DISASTER MANAGEMENT' is planned on January 23, 2019, at CNE Lecture Hall, College of Nursing, CMC, Vellore
