Thousands of patients would go uncared without knowledge of nurses on toxicology for each year which would lead to severely handicapped individuals or loss of life. Caring for patients with poisoning is challenging for nurses and they need to be equipped with adequate knowledge and specialized skills to recognize the needs of patients with poisoning and intervene appropriately. They need to be confident in applying the concepts of comprehensive care in their clinical practice.
