Celebration of World Hand Hygiene Day Town Campus and Ranipet Campus



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World Hand Hygiene Day celebrated annually on 5th May, “World Hand Hygiene Day” serves as a poignant reminder of the critical importance of hand hygiene in safeguarding public health. As the world continues to grapple with infectious diseases and global health challenges, this day underscores the simple yet effective act of hand hygiene in preventing the spread of illness and saving lives. The theme for world hand hygiene day 2024-“Why is sharing knowledge on hand hygiene is still so important” “emphasises on raising awareness about the importance of education and training on hand hygiene among the healthcare workers and visitors to prevent transmission infectious diseases and to ensure safety and quality in patient care. GRACE Project - General Rural and Community Laboratories Establishment

The Department of Clinical Microbiology organised the first GRACE training workshop - General Rural and Community Laboratories Establishment (Training personnel and strengthening laboratories across CMC mission network hospitals) between 6th - 11th May, 2024.

This workshop is envisaged to identify, train & strengthen the early identification of Infectious diseases in peripheral rural hospitals. Towards this, the microbiology diagnostic challenges faced among rural CMC network hospitals were identified, and laboratory personnel were invited to strengthen their diagnostic skills. Eight mission network hospitals sent eleven laboratory technicians for one week of hands-on training in the Department of Clinical Microbiology.

Chaplain Rev. Pearson inaugurated the programme with prayer and Dr. Beula Subashini the Course coordinator gave an overview of the programme. Dr. V. Balaji and other Senior Professors in Clinical Microbiology welcomed the participants. Dr. Julie H, Deputy Director (Missions) motivated the participants to continue to serve and be a witness across mission hospitals. Various topics, from basic to advanced techniques, were covered as lectures and hands-on work focused on the needs assessment done for hospitals. During the workshop, Dr Vijayanand, the Missions Coordinator, briefed the participants about the various mission activities CMC Vellore is involved in across the mission hospitals. The programme concluded with the valedictory function and certification of the participants on the final day. This workshop was supported by the first CMC Vellore Mission Network Grant, 2023 and Australian Alumni Grant, 2023, Australian Consulate General, Chennai.

The workshop was well appreciated by the participants, and they will be followed up through Distance Education Module.
