Services provided at the CMC Vellore Chittoor campus have steadily increased in the last few years.

TB Clinic:

The TB clinic on 30th April 2024 has started to detect and treat persons with TB. The clinic is a partnership with the government TB programme (NTEP) and is supported for testing (Truenat) and drugs (fixed dose combination drugs) by the government. Dr O C Abraham opened the facility and cut the ribbon along with Dr. DJ Christopher and Dr. Venkata Prasad, the District Leprosy, AIDS and TB officer and additional district medical officer (Addl DMHO). Mr. Santosh, the district TB programme coordinator, and other government staff attended the programme. The Department of Pulmonary Medicine, CMC Vellore, financially supported the clinic's construction. The TB clinic is located close to the medicine OPD (North) and is managed by medicine and community health units.

New South OPD Extension:

On June 5th, 2024, the new South OPD Extension was inaugurated by Dr. Rajesh I, Medical Superintendent, CMC Vellore. The extension to South OPD includes 10 new consulting rooms with MRO, cash counter and nurse's station. This extension is planned for the use of psychiatry and the super specialty OPDs like Rheumatology, Nephrology and Urology. June 5th was also World Environment Day, and various activities, including tree planting, nature walks and 'shramdhan', were conducted to commemorate this important day.

Research Office:

On 10th June 2024, the research office was inaugurated by Dr. Jacob John, Vice Principal of Research. This facility is a refurbished container with seating for 8 research staff members who have recently joined on various projects of the community health unit. The three current ongoing major research projects include an ICMR national priority health research (NHRP) that is testing the implementation of strategies to strengthen ambulatory care for NCD at public health facilities in Chittoor district, a multisite ICMR study, in collaboration with Lifestyle medicine, RUHSA and Healing fields (an NGO working in Bihar and Jharkhand) is testing implementation of community volunteer models to improve healthy lifestyle adoption by the community and a Gates foundation study developing a model for primary health care delivery that ensures continuity and referral linkages.



Dr. Sunil Agarwal Memorial (SAM) Project for Mission Hospitals

The Missions Department is happy to announce that for the third consecutive year, the Dr. Sunil Agarwal Memorial grant for Re-skilling and Training of Health professionals from Mission hospitals was awarded to four candidates from different Mission Hospitals across the country who underwent 10 days to 4 weeks training in various departments at CMC Vellore. The following is a brief excerpt of their training at CMC Vellore and how it would enhance the healthcare services in some of the needy parts of our country.

Dr. Blessy Sucharita

Dr. Blessy Sucharita, Consultant Paediatrician at Duncan Hospital, Raxaul in Bihar underwent 3 weeks of training in Paediatric Intensive Care Unit on the current guidelines, to enhance skills in managing critically ill children. The programme helped expand her knowledge of updated management techniques, protocols and procedures in paediatric critical care, especially proficiency in the use of portable ultrasound at the bedside for critically ill patients. One of the major skills was initiating USG-guided IV lines which has proven very helpful at Duncan. These simulation classes helped her understand the management of different arrhythmias, cardioversion, defibrillation etc. Comprehensive insights into ventilator management helped gain confidence in the usage of AIRVO and CPAP machines and in preventing post-extubation failures.



Ms. Katherine Sweety Joy

Ms. Katherine Sweety Joy works as a Physiotherapist at The Leprosy Mission Hospital, Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh. She underwent three weeks of training in various areas under the PMR (Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation) Department. “It gave me an enriching opportunity to learn about musculoskeletal conditions, Haemophilia patients and diverse cases ranging from paediatrics to post-operative care.”

Along with the vibrant atmosphere of therapy and fellowship, the Rehab Mela highlighted the remarkable resilience and achievements of Spinal Cord Injury patients, inspiring her to focus on musculoskeletal and paediatric conditions in the coming year at TLM Ayodhya.

Dr. George Varghese

Dr. George Varghese is a Dentist and Public Health officer at Kachhwa Christian Hospital, Uttar Pradesh. One of the needs has been to develop and strengthen Palliative service in and around Kachhwa, especially in the surrounding rural communities. Dr. Varghese underwent a 10-day programme in the Palliative Medicine unit at CMC Vellore and gained valuable insights through IPD rounds, OPD consultations, and home visits, the structured approach to patient care, including psychosocial support, medication management, and caregiver training, highlighted the department's commitment to holistic care. The various interactions with dedicated professionals, hospice visits, and presentations provided a comprehensive understanding of palliative care practices. This would greatly benefit the hospital at Kachhwa in implementing systems that could be sustained and benefit more patients.





Ms. Baarlinda Kahiri

Ms. Baarlinda Kharir is an ICU Nurse working at Dr. Gordon Robert's Hospital in Shillong, Meghalaya. The hospital is in the process of developing a Burns unit and Ms. Baarlinda underwent three weeks of training in the Burns Ward under the Nursing Services at CMC Vellore. It was a very comprehensive training in the Burns OPD, Plastic surgery OR, various ICUs etc. with training in specific skills ranging from assessing and dressing burns, surgical procedures and assisting in various flap surgeries, keloid management, fluid management, paediatric cases, keloid management, fluid management, paediatric cases,

burns rehabilitation etc. These all gave great insight and practical knowledge in managing burn patients at various stages.

Dr. Sunil Agarwal was passionate about training numerous mission hospital doctors and staff at CMC Vellore and this grant has enabled enabling to continue supporting mission hospitals in developing the capacity knowledge, the skill level of healthcare staff across the spectrum.

Dedication of the CHAD ENT Clinic



Community ENT care is aimed at providing basic health care for ear, nose and throat disorders in the community by training personnel and providing infrastructure to achieve a healthy community. Dr. Anand Job, former Head of the Department of ENT and Head of ENT, Unit -1, was deeply passionate about reaching the “unreached” - section of the community. ENT-1 has provided ear care and hearing rehabilitation in partnership with Christoffel Blinden Mission (CBM) for the past 25 years. He dedicated the refurbished the clinic on 07 June 24 to serve the poor of the Kaniyambadi block and Jawadhu Hills. Dr. Venkata Raghava, Professor & Head of the Department of CHAD, Senior Prof of CHAD, Dr. Vinod Abraham and Dr. Regi Thomas, Head of ENT-1, presided over the meeting along with CHAD and ENT-1 faculty. A newly refurbished outpatient consultation room equipped with an HD endoscope system and microscope for OPD evaluation and future surgical use was installed and dedicated to the occasion. The facility is also equipped to screen adults for hearing loss and is being upgraded to screen Neonates and digital hearing screening of the community. Dr. Miria Mathew, who has recently joined the Institution with several years of experience managing a rural ENT clinic at EHA, Herbetpur, will offer consultation services at this centre.



Congratulations! Central Sterile Supply Department



CMC Skull Base Course: Principle for Practice in Anterior Endoscopic Approach





Department of Neurosurgery Unit 1 & Department of ENT, Unit-1 along with Department of Anatomy organised a unique hands-on instructional course at the Ranipet and Bagayam Campus. The Endonasal Endoscopic Skull Base surgery training was modelled based on the University of Pittsburgh Cranial Based Surgery training; this course is designed to train ENT surgeons and neurosurgeons in India with new developments, and innovations practised world over to treat pathologies at the base skull. The training aimed to teach correct principles and surgical techniques to deliver better patient care and achieve a complication-free outcome.

On 23 – 25 May 2024, 60 delegates from all over India and 2 Neurosurgeons from Nepal participated. The 3-day course was themed Principles for Practice in Anterior Endoscopic Approaches with the guidance of course directors Dr. Suganthy R. Prof of Anatomy, Prof Regi Thomas, Prof ENT and Dr Krishna Prabhu, Prof Neurosurgery. It involved lectures and demonstrations of surgical procedures on cadavers by senior faculty at CMC and outside. The six pairs of ENT-Neuro Surgeon team were given a cadaver each to perform the procedures taught during the course. As part of the course, world-renowned Skull Base surgeons from The University of Pittsburgh, Prof Carl Snyderman (ENT) & Prof Paul Gardner (Neurosurgery) and The University of Adelaide, Prof Peter-John Wormald, gave a keynote address virtually on advanced management protocols in SB surgery. The course was well appreciated by both in-house and external participants.

A cadaver lab has been established to teach and train the Skull Base surgery team (ENT & Neurosurgeons) and to teach endonasal endoscopic surgery in training at CMC Vellore. The lab was inaugurated by Professor (Rtd) Anand Job, a senior surgeon from CMC Vellore and a mentor to many at the Department of ENT at the Christian Medical College Vellore. The Alumni Grant Scheme, 2022, granted to Dr. Rajan Sundaresan and team, partly supported the lab and has been dedicated in honour of the famous and CMCs' beloved Australian Surgeon Edward Woodall Gault. We celebrate the life of this great man who laid down his passion for surgery and became a pathologist as needed, living the motto "Not to be served, but to serve".
