Celebrating World Occupational Therapy Day

Theme: Occupational Therapy for All

World Occupational Therapy Day, celebrated on October 27th each year since 2010, highlights the vital role Occupational Therapy (OT) plays in healthcare. This day serves as a platform for the global OT community (OT practitioners' students) to come together, share experiences, and promote the profession's impact on health and well-being.



Occupational therapy is centred on helping individuals engage in meaningful activities, or "occupations," that enhance their quality of life. From supporting children in developing crucial motor skills to assisting adults recovering from strokes, managing mental health challenges, helping seniors maintain independence and supporting individuals returning to work after an injury; OTs address a wide range of needs. Occupational therapy is a bridge to improving quality of life. Our work enhances a person's ability to participate in day-to-day activities that bring purpose, satisfaction, and a sense of achievement, whether it's managing daily routines, accessing the workplace, or staying active in social and leisure pursuits.

This year's theme, "Occupational Therapy for All," emphasises our commitment to making OT accessible to individuals of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds. The word "All" is a short but versatile term that can serve as a pronoun, adjective, adverb, or noun. "All" can refer to 'everything or everyone.' As a noun it indicates the 'entirety of something' or to use one's whole energy, resources, or self and can intensify an adjective, meaning 'completely or entirely.' It highlights the holistic approach of occupational therapy, where OTs consider all aspects of a person's life—physical, emotional, social, and environmental—that may influence their ability to engage in daily activities.

Occupational therapy is about understanding each person's unique circumstance and then helping them engage in activities that enhance their independence, confidence, and health. OTs interpret "All" as encompassing every aspect of an individual's life that could influence their ability to participate in daily activities, including physical, emotional, social, and environmental factors. This perspective helps OTs address 'all' dimensions that might impact a person's function, such as physical limitations, psychological well-being, cultural influences, and the client's goals and routines.

In practice, this approach means considering 'all' elements that contribute to meaningful engagement in activities. It pushes OTs to look beyond specific impairments, exploring how everything from home setup to family dynamics affects a person's success in therapy and their ability to perform daily tasks in their natural settings. As OTs, we are dedicated to this mission and committed to working collaboratively with other health professionals, policymakers, and community members to ensure that OT remains inclusive, empowering, and available to everyone who needs it.

With a world that's growing more aware of diverse health needs, this year's theme urges us to make OT accessible, so all individuals can participate in the occupations they value and live life to the fullest.

Obituary

Dr. A. S. Kanagasabapathy (fondly known as Dr. A.S.K) joined the Clinical Laboratory, CMC in the year 1966, under the Headship of Dr. Carman. He was appointed as the First Head of Clinical Biochemistry in the year 1970. With the awareness and importance of monitoring the quality of results, he introduced the In- house Internal quality Control (IQC) in 1968, the first of its kind in a teaching hospital in India. Along with Dr. Carman and Dr. Peter Hill, he set up the continuous-flow auto analyser in 1970, the first ever autoanalyzer in India. He upgraded the routine diagnostic laboratory into a teaching department for short term postings for M.D Biochemistry, Pathology & M.Sc. Biochemistry courses, CMAI and tutor Lab Technician courses.



In 1978, in order to bring about improvement in the quality of laboratory services in India, Dr A.S.K started the first indigenous ACBI/CMC EQAS programme for Indian Clinical labs. He introduced many in-house RIA assays, Automated Discrete Selective Analyzer for Chemistry, the first in a teaching hospital in India, Automated Enzyme Immunoassay System for Hormones, contributing towards better patient care. He has conducted more than 100 QC seminars and workshops through “Outreach programmes” in many mission hospital labs in all the regions of the country. He was associated with WHO in various laboratory quality control activities.

Dr. A.S.K was known for his unexplainable intelligence, untiring hard work, unstoppable words of potentiality. A Luminary in the field of Clinical Biochemistry, a dynamic, inspiring, & brilliant teacher, a mentor and Leader who nurtured the staff of the department. Teaching was his passion with a significant impact on a large cross section of students from laboratory technologists to medical post graduates with his excellent interaction, motivation that kept his students enthralled. His tireless pursuit of excellence, dedication and commitment to quality, has set high standards inspiring generations of students, fellow colleagues, Industrial leaders, Lab professionals in India and neighbouring countries. He was the First Voice and Founder of Quality Assurance in Laboratory Medicine in India, with a great passion for Quality in clinical laboratories and was fondly known as the ‘Father of Quality control in India’. A great Administrator, a model Professor & an Inspiring Researcher, he was a much respected and loved colleague whose advice was always sought after. He is known for his ever smiling demeanour and kindness, a great Humane and a gentleman to the core with Personification of Humility.

He served as Deputy Director (Centenary project -2000) from 1995 - 1999. His valuable sincere and tireless service towards the CMC centenary celebrations was much appreciated. He was an active Rotarian and as a President he carried out several community service projects involving CMC students for rural health camps, youth leadership and vocational service programs. After his retirement in 2000, he dedicated himself in spreading the concept of quality control and laboratory standards for Accreditation among clinical laboratories. He was associated with NABL and with QCI. He was also the recipient of the ‘CMC Alumni Award of Distinction -2012.’

He was a committed husband to his extremely supportive wife Mrs. Lakshmi (late) and a loving father to his 2 daughters, Dr. Akila (MBBS batch 1981, CMC) & Dr. Nalini (MBBS Batch 1989, CMC); Sons in law - Dr. Narasimhan (Cardiology : 1989 -1992) & Dr. Ramanujam and an affectionate grandfather. His contributions to Clinical biochemistry will remain an enduring testimony to his dedication and expertise. Quality and Dr. Kanagasabapathy were inseparable.

The CMC family and Department of Clinical Biochemistry expresses our deepest gratitude to Dr.Kanagasabapathy and we thank God for his life of service.
