Conclave of Medical Colleges



As part of the celebration of 125 years of CMC Vellore and Consultation 2025, a **Conclave of Medical Colleges** under Christian minority category was organised by the Missions Department on the 12th of April, Saturday at the CMC Vellore. Ranipet Campus. 12 Christian institutions from across the country including CMC Vellore were part of the conclave. Each of the colleges were represented either by their Director, Principal or Medical Superintendent, and a senior faculty. The need to work together in today's milieu, the possibility of sharing best and ethical practices was emphasised along with sharing human resourses for service commitments in missions and areas of need.

Overall Vision:

To strengthen the four main domains of a healthy and socially responsible Christian institution—Education, Service, Research, and Outreach (E-S-R-O).

Objective of the Conclave:

To discuss ways of working together to improve medical education, service delivery and medical research and community outreach in India by sharing and adopting best practices.

Dr. Jachin Velavan, Associate Director (Missions) welcomed the delegates followed by devotion by Rev. Finney Alexander based on the theme verse Nehemiah 2:18. The opening remarks was delivered by Dr. Vikram Mathews, Director encouraging all to come together as we face unique challenges in a rapidly changing environment and share experiences and explore ways of collaborating in areas of complementary strengths.

Dr. Solomon Sathishkumar, Principal, Dr. Rajesh I, Medical superintendent, Dr. Succeena Alexander, Vice-Principal (PG), Dr. Venkata Raghava, head of CHAD, Dr. Venkatesan, Head of LCECU and Dr. Jachin Velavan each spoke on 'ESRO', respectively. Each participating institution presented similarly on these four domains, discussing various challenges and strategies followed by an enriching group discussion.

The conclave was the first step towards achieving the vision of understanding each institution's strengths and identifying areas. One of the major takeaways was to have a formal body dedicated to nurturing collaborative initiatives with representations from the Christian healthcare community, government and research.

This Conclave is a major milestone especially in the 125th year of CMC Vellore and is envisioned to be part of deliberations for Consultation 2025 towards fostering a continual engagement for strategizing future collaborations in impacting healthcare across the country.



Dr. Sunil Agarwal Memorial (SAM) Project for Mission Hospitals

Facilitated by the Missions Department, CMC Vellore, the Dr. Sunil Agarwal Memorial Project – Grant for Re-skilling and Training of Health professionals from Mission hospitals instituted in memory of Lt. Dr. Sunil Agarwal, Professor of Vascular Surgery at CMC Vellore was awarded to six candidates from 5 different mission hospitals during the period 2024-25. This is the fourth year of the grant, and the recipients underwent training ranging from 2 to 4 weeks at different periods between July 2024 to March 2025.

Below is a brief excerpt of their training at CMC Vellore and how the programme facilitates upskilling of staff and contributes to enhancing services through them in their respective mission hospitals.

Dr. Martha Johnson

Dr. Martha Johnson, Head of Laboratory Services at Christian Fellowship Hospital Oddanchatram, underwent a four-week training programme in the Department of Microbiology at CMC. The well-structured programme, supportive faculty, and hands-on experience in media preparation, cultures, and serology, greatly helped in enhancing her knowledge and skills. It has helped in implementing newfound knowledge in the laboratory at CFH, Oddanchatram contributing to improved patient care.



Ms. Kasturi Kusulia

Ms. Kasturi Kusulia, Staff Nurse at Christian Hospital Bissamcuttack, underwent four-week exposure training in the ICU through the Nursing Services. Valuable insights were gained in documentation, stock management, equipment management, staff management, and infection control protocols. Exposure was provided to new equipment and procedures, including ABP, IAP, and dialysis in ICU.

Ms. Alisha Sahu

Ms. Alisha Sahu, Staff Nurse from Christian Hospital Bissamcuttack, completed a four-week training in advanced neonatal care in the NICU, Level I Nursery, and Level II/III Nursery through the Nursing Services. Despite coming from a remote, resource-limited hospital, she learned extensively about systematic procedures, incubator management, documentation, milk bank operations, and staff responsibilities. The supportive and knowledgeable senior staff guided her patiently, enhancing her understanding and confidence. She is motivated to apply feasible practices and further enhance the neonatal care and services at CHB, Bissamcuttack.

Ms. Preeja

Ms. Preeja, Staff Nurse from Somervell Memorial CSI Medical College & Hospital, Karakonam. Critical Care Nursing Programme under Sunil Agarwal Memorial (SAM) project, provided valuable knowledge and skills in critical care nursing. The programme covered various aspects, including tracheostomy care, suctioning, and medication management.

The guidance and support provided by Ms. Jancy Mary Joy, Nursing Manager, and Ms. Jancy Rani, MICU Incharge, as well as the entire MICU and MHDU staff, demonstrated exceptional teamwork, skill, and knowledge in providing patient care. This experience has enhanced knowledge and skills, and will be implemented in the hospital to provide excellent patient care and nursing education.

Dr. Hepsiba Glory Alpheus

Dr. Hepsiba Alpheus, Physician from Padhar Hospital underwent a two-week training in Echocardiography in the Cardiology department. The program covered foundational aspects of Echocardiography, allowing her to gain essential skills and confidence to perform ECHO independently at her home institution, Padhar Hospital. She has been able to translate the learnings into practice at Padhar and it has been enhancing their services. The overall experience was enriching and productive.

It has been encouraging to see many interested in availing this opportunity from various Mission Hospitals. Few representatives from the MBBS Batch of 78 also joined for a fellowship breakfast with few of the recipients, faculty from various departments and the Missions team and it was a time of sharing and encouragement.





Dr. Ajith Joseph Mathew

Dr. Ajit Mathew, Orthopedic consultant from Herbertpur Christian Hospital, Uttarakhand underwent 3 weeks of intensive hands-on training in arthroplasty, arthroscopy, spine, and trauma cases in the Department of Orthopaedics. The support from the department, access to advanced facilities, sterilisation processes, interactions with implant personnel, implant procurement process and reliable vendor contacts, visits to Trauma and other related units added practical insights and enriched his learning. The new contacts made will help him explore future areas of collaboration between the Department of Orthopedics and Mission hospitals in general.

The support from each of the departments in CMC in facilitating these trainings effectively and in posttraining follow-up of the trained staff is greatly appreciated.

Inauguration of Neonatal Hearing Screening

The Universal Neonatal Hearing Screening (UNHS) programme in CMC Vellore is being offered as a regular service by ENT Unit-IV along with Neonatology department since 2010. It was initiated as an ICMR project by Dr. Achamma Balraj, former Professor and Head of the Department of ENT. This programme aims to screen all newborns for hearing loss before discharge, thereby facilitating the early detection and rehabilitation of hearing loss in newborns. So far, this programme was operational from one small room on the 3rd floor of ISSCC building. Currently we have an additional space on the 4th floor of ISSCC building for this programme.

The inauguration ceremony for the new neonatal hearing screening room was held on 9th April, 2025. Dr. Ann Mary Augustine, Head of ENT Unit -IV, delivered the welcome address. Dr. David Mathew, Deputy MS, Dr. Suma Susan Mathews, Head of the Department of ENT and Dr. Santhanam Sridhar, Head of Neonatology Unit-I, shared their felicitations and inaugurated the room. Rev. Paul Ravikumar offered the prayer of dedication.



The Department of ENT and ENT Unit-IV is grateful to God for His mercies and the administration for providing the additional space to facilitate this service. We are grateful to all in the Department of Neonatology for their support and to all the nursing staff in the postnatal wards and nursery for their help and co-operation, in ensuring that this service is executed successfully. The enthusiasm and hard work of all the Neonatal Hearing Screening technicians needs special mention. We hope that this milestone in the Neonatal Hearing Screening programme will go a long way in carrying out this programme more efficiently over the coming years, to the glory of God and the benefit of our patients.



CME on Approach to Headache Disorders

The Department of Continuing Medical Education and the Department of Neurology organized a CME Approach to Headache Disorders on 26th April, 2025. The programme was moderated by Dr. Deepti Bal, Associate Professor, Department of Neurology. The speakers, Dr. Sanjith Aaron, Dr. George Abraham Ninan, Dr. Vivek Mathew, Dr. Deepti Bal, Dr. Selvakumar, Dr. G. Nagendra Babu, and Dr. V.
