Dr. Jacob George Retires



Dr. Jacob George, Senior Professor, Department of PMR, retired on the 8th of April 2025 after 25 years of service to the institution. Having completed his MBBS in 1991 and internship in 1992 at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore, he worked for a year at Thiruvalla Medical Mission Hospital, Kerala. He did his DNB (PMR) from CMC Vellore between 1996 and 1999 and joined as a Research Officer in the Department of PMR in November 2000. He was appointed Professor in November 2010 and took charge as Head of PMR Unit 2 in December 2018 and thereafter as Head of the Department of PMR from December 2019 to 2023. He was a good clinician, leading teams providing comprehensive and compassionate interdisciplinary care to patients with multiple, complex disabilities. He took keen interest in teaching undergraduate and postgraduate students. The Masters in Occupational Therapy course and the postgraduate diploma in Rehabilitation Medicine with the Distance Education unit were started during this period. He was involved in various research projects and had 17 publications to his credit in indexed medical journals.

The initial two years of Headship were during the COVID pandemic, and he managed responsibilities towards rearranging infrastructure and human resources. Following COVID, he completed various projects such as acquiring the Rehab ambulance with assistance from CBM, completing the Bitumen road at Rehab Institute, improving the canteen, parking and storage facilities at Rehab, online billing and paying systems at Rehabilitation Institute, CMC Vellore. He also facilitated the initiation of CATER - the Centre for Advanced Technology-Enabled Rehabilitation on January 31, 2022, under the Rehab Engineering section. A new joint project with PENTA USA significantly benefited to marginalised patients with prosthetic and orthotic needs.

He contributed towards development of PMR department in various hospitals. He was involved in the consultation and development of the Rehabilitation services at the CSI Mission Hospital and Rehabilitation Centre at Kodakkal, Malappuram, Kerala. He was also involved in the development of the PMR Department at Square Hospital, Bangladesh from May 2009 to September 2010 and at CIHSR, Dimapur, Nagaland from February 2014 to August 2014. On behalf of the MOH and Social Welfare of the United Republic of Tanzania and Muhimbili National Hospital, he was invited to evaluate and advise on the existing rehabilitation services facility and academic programme from March 2013 to April 2013.

His wife, Dr. Beela Sarah Mathew, is Professor in the Department of Radiation Oncology, Regional Cancer Centre, Thiruvananthapuram, and his son, Tony, works as a pilot with the Indigo Airlines. The Department of PMR at CMC Vellore is grateful to Dr. Jacob George for his efficient and dedicated service to the institution, and we wish him success in all his future endeavours.

Raising Awareness: Hospital Infection Control Committee hosts Heat-Related Illness Programme at Ranipet Campus.

India has a tropical climate and experiences hotter summers stretching between March and May with maximum temperatures in certain parts reaching at least 40°C. As a response to the consistently rising ambient temperatures the Hospital Infection Control Committee under the leadership of the Medical Superintendent's Office, with active support from the Heat Related Illness (HRI) Task Force, Nursing Superintendent Office and the General Superintendent Office had organised a three-day HRI awareness campaign for patients, visitors, and healthcare workers from 28th to 30th April 2025 at Ranipet Campus.



The aim of the HRI campaign was to raise awareness about heat-related health risks and provide practical measures on keeping people safe during extreme heat by promoting hydration, proper ventilation, and heat illness prevention along with recognising the early signs of heatstroke which is a medical emergency with emphasis on vulnerable populations, including the elderly, outdoor workers, pregnant women, and children.

The inaugural programme commenced on 28th April 2025, with a worship song by the Infection Control nurses and followed by prayer from our Chaplain Rev. Romit Borogaon. The welcome address was offered by Mrs. Reena Rachel George, Addl Joint secretary HICC, she highlighted the importance of initiating HRI awareness campaign and applauded the activities taken for disseminating information to the public regarding Heat Related Illness and its prevention and reminders (posters, pamphlets, digital display) and the efforts taken by the organizing team under the guidance of Dr. Hema Paul Physician & Senior HIC Officer. Felicitations were offered by Dr. Balamugesh. T, Associate Medical Superintendent, Ranipet, who mentioned the efforts in mitigating the impact of heat on public health and need to ensure health facility preparedness through sensitisation of medical professionals during the anticipated heatwaves. Dr. Jenifer Jeba, lead of HRI task force, reinforced the need for early HRI identification and timely reporting, monitoring, treatment and prevention. She also mentioned the necessary preventive steps taken by the HRI task force. Mr Prem Chander Head, ACMU pointed out the role of sustainable cooling measures as an urgent necessity in tackling extreme heat. The event concluded by vote of thanks proposed by Dr. Sarah Graceia, Asst Professor & HIC Officer.



The events for the three days included activities such as informational stall with posters and display of protective measures such as hat, umbrella, sunscreen and healthy food choices to be considered during the summer. Handouts were distributed in Hindi, Tamil, Bengali and English, along with an engaging puppet shows and availability of free drinking water to public. Additionally digital monitors displayed information on HRI prevention in Ranipet Campus.

Together we can beat the heat and stay safe this summer.

CMC Vellore Celebrates World Thalassemia Day

Christian Medical College (CMC) Vellore observed World Thalassemia Day on May 9, 2025. The programme was initiated by Dr. Aby Abraham, Head of the Department, and Dr. Sushil Selvarajan, Associate Professor, with expert coordination by Ms. Gomathi Joseph, Senior Social Worker. The event aimed to emphasise the importance of raising awareness about Thalassemia and the role of stem cell transplants in treatment, reaching out to the general public.



Programme Highlights

The programme began with an opening prayer by Rev. Ebenezer, Chaplain. Following the prayer, Dr. Sharon Anbumalar Lionel, Professor, shared valuable insights on Thalassemia awareness, management, and curative options.

Her presentation covered:

- Types of Thalassemia
- Regular monthly transfusions of packed red blood cells
- Chelation therapy
- Stem cell transplantation



The message was translated into Hindi by Ms. Rizwana A, Social Worker, and into Tamil by Ms. Chammundeswari, Department Secretary. Ms. Arifa S, Clinical Assistant, skillfully conducted the programme as per the scheduled agenda. Dr. Eunice Sindhuvi. E, Professor, spoke about Thalassemia prevention, covering the basics of hemoglobin synthesis, Thalassemia inheritance, and stressing the importance of screening for the condition. Ms. Lillian Percy Kujur, Head of Specialty Nursing Unit, explained the nursing management and care for Thalassemia, with translations provided in Tamil by Sister Anbu Jeba, Haemophilia, Nurse Coordinator.

Entertainment A heartwarming dance performance was presented by Ms. Shrishti Rani, a Thalassemia post-transplant patient. Her graceful performance not only showcased her incredible talent but also symbolised resilience and hope, inspiring everyone present.

Missions Sabbatical for Reynolds Memorial Hospital & Affiliated Clinics, Washim, Maharashtra

CMC Vellore invites senior faculty who are eligible for sabbatical to take a mission sabbatical and help in pioneering the service at Reynolds Memorial Hospital. The Mission Sabbatical is as per institutional policy and can be availed by confirmed staff who are eligible for sabbatical leave. It does not entail a service obligation. During the period of the mission sabbatical, the staff will continue to receive their full salary from CMC, including other benefits. Travel and accommodation will be supported.

Reynolds Memorial Hospital in Washim is an 89-year-old hospital located in the Vidarbha region of Maharashtra. Started in 1936 by Dr. Orpha Speicher, an American missionary from the Church of the Nazarene, it evolved from a mud-walled school building into a thriving hospital that also pioneered nursing education to empower the local community. The Vidarbha region is one of the worst drought-hit areas in the country and has been known for high farmer suicide rates. There is a great need for ethical, cost-effective medical care and an opportunity to bring about positive change in the region. A functional hospital committed to delivering holistic, compassionate care is essential. Moreover, a base hospital is necessary to continue training qualified nurses who would respond to the needs of the region.

Since 2017, the hospital has been managed under a tripartite partnership between Christian Medical College Vellore, Emmanuel Hospital Association, and the Church of the Nazarene. The hospital has good infrastructure, including a functional OPD area, laboratory, X-ray machine, well-equipped labor room, newly constructed operation theatre, medical ICU with ventilators, and an oxygen plant. The hospital has an attached College of Nursing – the Nazarene Nurses Training College – running ANM and BSc Nursing programs with about 200 students and has well-established infrastructure.

The need of the hour is for people who would be willing to join this endeavor and respond to the needs of the region. We invite doctors, nurses, allied health professionals, and anyone who is interested to partner and make a difference. We are inviting individuals or couples to join as a team of professionals for a period of 6 months to 1 year to meet this need.
