Mrs. Mories Sankar Retires



Mrs. Mories Sankar, Associate Professor, Obstetrics and Gynaecology Department retired from College of Nursing, Christian Medical College Vellore on 5th May, 2025 after 35 years of dedicated and memorable service in the institution. Born in 1965 to a schoolteacher, she treasured her childhood spent alongside her six sisters. She completed GNM in 1990 and PBBSc Nursing in 1998 at College of Nursing, CMC Vellore and continued to work as a staff nurse in Nursery. She served as a passionate charge nurse in the Nursery from 1998 to 2010. In 2010, she pursued her MSc in Nursing, specialising in Obstetrics and Gynaecology, and later returned to continue her work in the Nursery. With 31 years of dedicated service, she devoted her career to caring for neonates, consistently ensuring safe and high-quality care for every baby entrusted to her. From 2012 to 2014, she also held the role of Nurse Manager in the Labour Room, further demonstrating her commitment and leadership in maternal and newborn care.

In 2004, she was awarded Senior Training Fellowship by our institution for undergoing training in neonatal care on ventilator, incubator, bubble CPAP machine and total parenteral nutrition at Adelaide, Australia. This enabled her to contribute immensely in improving the neonatal nursing care practices. She also specialised in lactation counselling in the year 2007. In 2022, she underwent a training in neonatal resuscitation and has been instrumental in training 250 staff nurses in this field. Mrs. Mories was an excellent clinical nurse who constantly strived towards ensuring infection control practices in the Nursery. She was truly a mother to the neonates and to the staff nurses working under her. Gentle but firm, she was known for maintaining the policies and protocols at her workplace. She emphasised the importance of work-life balance and has taken lot of efforts to ensure staff welfare in the department. She served as a role model and inspired nursing students through her midwifery classes.

Mrs. Mories is blessed with a beautiful family. She is married to Mr. Sankar. They have a daughter, Mrs. Angelein Geno, and a son-in-law, Mr. Mithilesh. Her enduring impact and contributions to the institution and to the nursing are immeasurable. CMC Vellore wishes her a happy, healthy and blessed retired life.

Congratulations to the Department of Haematology, CMC Vellore for its Outstanding Thalassemia Care

Coal India Limited's (CIL) Thalassemia Bal Sewa Yojana (TBSY) programme celebrated World Thalassemia Day on 8th May, 2025. On this occasion, the Department of Haematology, Christian Medical College (CMC) Vellore received an award for securing 1st place in India. The award is titled 'Gift of Life through Thalassemia Bal Sewa Yojana', a Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative of the CIL, and the scheme aims at supporting underprivileged children suffering from thalassemia.



The award was presented by Shri G. Kishan Reddy, Honourable Union Minister of Coal and Mines, Govt. of India, in the presence of Shri Satish Chandra Dubey, Honourable Minister of State for Coal and Mines, Govt. of India; Shri Vikram Dev Dutt, IAS, Secretary, Ministry of Coal, Govt. of India; Ms. Punya Salila Srivastava, IAS, Secretary, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India; and PM Prasad, Chairman, CIL. Dr. Vikram Mathews, Director of CMC Vellore; Ms. Gomathi Joseph, Senior Social Worker, Department of Haematology; Dr. Sharon Anbumalar; Dr. Eunice Sindhuvi; and Ms. Rizwana, Social Worker, Department of Haematology were present to receive the award.

About TBSY Programme:

The TBSY programme was initiated in 2017, with Phase I facilitating 73 transplants. Phase II saw 63 transplants (50 Thalassemia, 13 Aplastic Anemia), while Phase III facilitated 70 transplants (63 Thalassemia, including 3 MUD, and 7 Aplastic Anemia). To date, the programme has successfully facilitated 206 transplants (184 Thalassemia and 20 Aplastic Anemia).

Funding and Impact:

Through this project, CIL has utilised funding amounting to ₹18,71,95,387/-, which has significantly contributed to the programme's success.

Expert Committee and Partnering Hospitals:

The programme boasts an expert committee comprising eight esteemed members from India, including Dr. Vikram Mathews. A total of 17 hospitals nationwide, including CMC Vellore, partner with CIL for bone marrow transplants.

Dr. Vikram Mathews' Contribution:

Dr. Vikram Mathews shared valuable insights on guidance documents for Hematopoietic Stem Cell Transplant for Thalassemia Major, covering pre-transplant risk assessment, the importance of early HSCT, stem cell sources, and post-transplant care.

CME on Update in Hepatobiliary and Transplant Anaesthesia



The Department of Anaesthesia, Christian Medical College Vellore, organised a one-day Continuing Medical Education (CME) programme titled, *Update in Hepatobiliary and Transplant Anaesthesia* on 17th May 2025. The event was held in Jacob Chandy Hall and CK Job Hall, located in the Paul Brand Building, and featured hybrid participation, with 100 in-person delegates and 75 virtual attendees. The CME brought together renowned international and national faculty through both live and virtual sessions, focusing on the latest updates and evidence-based practices in the field of anaesthesia for liver surgeries and abdominal organ transplantation.

Short Course on Peritoneal Dialysis



The Departments of Nephrology and Medical Surgical Nursing, speciality IX (Nephrology Nursing), along with the Continuing Nursing Education and Research Department, conducted their 6th batch of the short course in Peritoneal Dialysis for nurses, between the 1st of April and the 10th of May, 2025. This was held as a 6-week blended programme with 4 weeks of online learning and 2 weeks of onsite training in the peritoneal dialysis unit of CMC Vellore. The workshop started with an inaugural programme on the 1st of April and concluded with the valedictory programme at the CNE video conferencing hall, in the College of Nursing. A total of four trainees participated in the programme, two from Maldives and two from Sri Lanka.

Faculty from the Departments of Nephrology and Medical Surgical Nursing, speciality IX (Nephrology Nursing), along with the Continuing Nursing Education and Research department, facilitated the sessions and the logistics. The course is endorsed by the International Society of Nephrology (ISN), the Peritoneal Dialysis Society of India (PDSI), and the Indian Society of Nephrology. This short course is designed to prepare registered nurses working in nephrology settings with specialised knowledge, skills, and competence in providing Peritoneal Dialysis (PD) to patients with End Stage Renal Disease. It also aims to equip them to educate, train, and counsel patients and caregivers on various aspects of Peritoneal Dialysis therapy. The nurses, through training, can take up autonomous roles as educators, facilitators, and counsellors, thus functioning as integral members of the Peritoneal Dialysis team. The delegates expressed a high degree of satisfaction while offering feedback on the course.
