First-ever Masterclass-'Gerimaster' Organised

The Department of Geriatrics, CMC Vellore, under the aegis of the Indian Academy of Geriatrics (IAG), successfully conducted the first-ever PG Masterclass - GERIMASTER from 5th to 7th June, 2025. This academic initiative brought together seventy postgraduate students and practitioners for an intensive and enriching learning experience in the ever-evolving field of geriatrics.

The stage was lit up for the inaugural session with inspiring talks by Dr.Vikram Mathews, Director and Dr. Rajesh. I. Medical Superintendent. This was followed by a welcome address by Dr. Prasad Mathews, the first Head of the Department of Geriatrics. The tone was set for the Masterclass by an inspiring speech by Prof. Alka Ganesh, mentor to many of the Professors in Geriatrics at CMC Vellore. The sessions covered a wide array of topics, from the foundations of multidisciplinary team-based approaches to practical skills like interpretation of ECG, pulmonary function tests (PFT), and arterial blood gas (ABG) analysis. Discussions also delved into rational drug prescribing, how to read a journal and research methodology.

The highlight of the event was the hands-on clinics, which allowed participants to apply theoretical knowledge directly to real-world clinical scenarios under expert supervision. Specialists from pulmonary medicine, cardiology, urology, and neurology presented recent advances in their respective fields. These sessions were thoughtfully moderated by geriatricians, who guided discussions on tailoring these advances to the unique needs of patients with multiple comorbidities and complex medication regimens. The masterclass was followed by a CME, which provided opportunities for luminaries in the field of law and palliative care to share their knowledge and experiences. Bone health and geriatric oncology were also dealt with effectively. Their contributions elevated the academic discourse and provided attendees with unique perspectives rooted in decades of experience. The participants left not only with knowledge but also with renewed compassion and conviction to serve older adults with dignity and excellence.

The postgraduate quiz was a highlight of GERIMASTER, with all participants enthusiastically competing for the prize. An alumni meeting was also incorporated into the programme. This inaugural gathering provided an opportunity for alumni to reconnect and share camaraderie as they reflected on more than a decade of shared memories. The event concluded with a gala dinner, attended by all participants.

The gathering began with a word of prayer by Ms. Priscilla, Asst. Chaplain. Mr. Anand John Samuel, Associate General Superintendent, Mr. Dinesh, Deputy General Superintendent, and Mr. Caleb, Associate Superintendent Engineer, graced the occasion with their presence. During his address, Mr. Anand John Samuel commended the unwavering efforts of the Food & Beverages team for their dedication in advancing food safety awareness and promoting healthy practices across the CMC community. A highlight of the day was the moving speech by Mr. Manuel Inbam, MBBS student and winner of the elocution competition, who captivated the audience with his award-winning presentation on Food Safety and Healthy Eating, leaving a lasting impression on all present. The programme emphasised the integration of scientific knowledge into practical lifestyle choices—especially vital within healthcare institutions, where nutrition and wellness are foundational to both personal and professional care. To further extend the reach of World Food Safety Day, awareness stalls were set up across the campus focusing on food safety, healthy eating, and science-backed nutritional tips. Interactive games conducted by the Hospital Management Studies & Staff Training Department and the Dietetics Department offered engaging learning experiences for all age groups.

Knowledge That Heals: Empowering Through Expert Voices

A hybrid educational seminar series was held from 11th to 13th June, 2025, offering an enriching blend of scientific insight, practical wisdom, and community-driven motivation. This dynamic three-day event was designed to educate, empower, and inspire participants to rethink the way they approach food, nutrition, and health within the CMC community. The series began with "Food as Medicine: Eating Your Way Out of Chronic Illness" by Dr. Samuel George Hansdak, Professor & Head, Lifestyle Medicine, followed by "The 3 C's in Understanding Obesity: Cognisance, Causes, Consequences" by Dr. Nitin Kapoor, Professor & Head (Unit 1), Endocrinology. Both speakers emphasised how lifestyle changes—particularly dietary habits—can be powerful tools in preventing and reversing chronic conditions. Day two focused on healing and gut wellness. Dr. Henry Prakash, Professor & Head, PMR, spoke on "Fuelling Recovery: The Role of Nutrition in Healing and Physical Performance," highlighting how food choices can directly impact recovery and strength.

This was followed by Dr. Noble Varghese Mathews, Assistant Professor, Gastroenterology, who presented "Diet and Gut Health: The Key Connection," shedding light on the essential relationship between diet and digestive health. The final day featured Mrs. B. Manimegalai, in charge, Dietetics, who delivered an insightful session on "My Plate: Hidden Treasure of Nutrition," helping participants understand the importance of balanced meals and mindful eating. The series concluded with Dr. Srinivasa Raghavan, Associate Professor, Developmental Paediatrics, who presented "The Future on Their Fork: Creating a Safe Food Culture for Healthy Child Growth," stressing the importance of shaping children's food environments for long-term health. Together, these sessions sparked meaningful conversations, ignited self-reflection, and inspired a collective resolve to prioritise safe, nutritious, and conscious food choices, resonating powerfully with this year's CMC motto: "Say No to Junk, Yes to Healthy Choices.

CME on Pragmatic Approach to Hypertensive Disorders of Pregnancy

On 14th June 2025, the Departments of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Obstetric Medicine, and Continuing Medical Education organised a CME on Pragmatic Approach to Hypertensive Disorders of Pregnancy in Low- and Middle-Income Countries. The speakers Dr. Sakte Reena Anand, Dr. Angeline Jacintha, and Dr. Tamma Anusha Reddy from the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Dr. Sheba Meriam Thomas and Dr. Sudha Jasmine from the Department of Medicine, and Dr. Justin Paul, a cardiologist from Madras Medical College discussed prediction and prevention of hypertensive disorders of pregnancy, antenatal management, delivery methods for hypertensive disorders, role of physicians before, during, and after pregnancy, medical conditions that may mimic hypertensive disorders of pregnancy, and long-term cardiovascular implications. The CME was moderated by Dr. Santosh Benjamin and Dr. Sowmya Sathyendra and attended by 220 participants from 11 states and several departments from CMC.
