It has flourished into one of the nation's foremost centres for medical education, healthcare, and related research, renowned nationally and internationally.

CMC Vellore is a leading tertiary-level medical institution known for pioneering quality medical services.

It encompasses a network of primary, secondary, tertiary, and quaternary care hospitals, with approximately 3,701 beds spread across seven campuses in and around Vellore. ”

Emergency Medical Service (EMS)

Care on the move

Launched in July 2024, CMC Vellore's Emergency Medical Service (EMS) enhances emergency care across the Vellore and Ranipet districts by providing timely inter-hospital transfers and out-of-hospital acute medical care. The service supports patients experiencing emergencies such as accidents, chest pain, stroke, or poisoning, ensuring they receive safe transport to definitive care.

The EMS fleet comprises eight outsourced ambulances, including five equipped for advanced life support and intensive care. Staffed by doctors, paramedics, and nurses, the service ensures critically ill adults and children are transferred swiftly to the appropriate campus for specialised treatment. Trauma cases, including road traffic accidents, are retrieved directly from the scene and brought to the CMC trauma centre at Ranipet.

Ambulances are stationed across the Town, Ranipet, and Bagayam campuses, with plans to expand coverage to the Chittoor campus. A 24/7 Ambulance Command Centre (ACC) coordinates all retrievals, accessible to both clinicians and the public via dedicated helplines: 97 91 97 97 97 and 0416 228 2280. This initiative has greatly benefited staff, students, and the broader communities of Vellore, Ranipet, and Chittoor by ensuring timely first aid, stabilisation, and safe transfer to emergency and trauma care facilities.



Paediatric Neurology

Splashing colours of recovery

Since its establishment in 2007, the Paediatric Neurology Unit at Christian Medical College (CMC) Vellore has provided specialised care for children with neurological disorders. Serving over 26,000 patients annually, the unit is a referral centre for families across India, especially from regions with limited access to advanced paediatric care.

Clinical services

- Comprehensive outpatient and inpatient care for a wide range of paediatric neurological conditions
- Advanced diagnostics including EEG, EMG, genetic testing, neurochemistry, and therapeutic drug monitoring
- State-of-the-art treatments such as:
 - Precision medicine for genetic epilepsies
 - Immunotherapy for autoimmune neurological disorders
 - Surgery for drug-resistant epilepsy
 - Bone marrow transplants for rare conditions like adrenoleukodystrophy and metachromatic leukodystrophy

Collaborative care

The unit works closely with child psychiatry, orthopaedics, rehabilitation services, and intensive care teams to provide integrated, multidisciplinary care

Training and Research

- Nationally accredited fellowship programmes train the next generation of paediatric neurologists
- Ongoing clinical research and participation in global trials addressing rare and complex neurological diseases

Expanding excellence

The Ranipet campus continues to expand its healthcare facilities and services.

A significant recent milestone was the inauguration of a state-of-the-art Hybrid Vascular Operating Theatre, which facilitates complex cardiovascular procedures, enhances surgical precision, and improves patient outcomes.

Looking ahead, a 350-bed Paediatric Speciality Centre is under development, with generous support from Fairfax Financial Holdings Ltd., Qess Corp and Ajit Isaac. Expected to open in 2026, the centre will offer advanced paediatric care, addressing the rising demand for specialised services for children from low-resource settings.



Several new specialised units have also been launched at the Ranipet Campus.

[Tobacco Cessation Centre](#)

Opened in September 2024 and virtually inaugurated by the Union Minister of Health, this centre provides personalised counselling, medical treatment, and holistic support to individuals seeking to quit tobacco, addressing both physical and psychological dimensions of addiction.



Pulmonary Medicine Research Lab

The Pulmonary Medicine Research Lab at CMC Vellore's Ranipet Campus was inaugurated in December 2024. It is a cutting-edge facility dedicated to enhancing the detection and treatment of serious lung diseases, including tuberculosis (TB), asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), and interstitial lung disease (ILD). A major priority of the lab is testing new point-of-care TB diagnostic tools. These tools are designed for use in smaller clinics and rural health centres, helping ensure faster and more accurate diagnoses where they are needed most. Early detection can save lives, especially in communities with limited access to specialist care.

The lab also features a specialised cell culture unit to study how lung tissue responds to diseases such as idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis (IPF) and lung damage caused by tuberculosis (TB). This work will help researchers better understand how the lungs heal, and what can be done when they don't.

Sleep Clinic

Home to a fully equipped Level 1 Sleep Lab, the clinic offers diagnosis and treatment for conditions such as sleep apnea, insomnia, and narcolepsy. It emphasises thorough evaluation, individualised therapy, and education to enhance patients' quality of life.



Allergy Skin Testing

The Allergy, Asthma & Immunology Clinic conducts targeted testing for allergies related to food, medication, and respiratory triggers. Results guide personalised treatment strategies that help patients better manage their symptoms.

Urban Paediatric Clinic Chinna Allapuram

Child-focused care in the heart of the community

Established in 2001, the Urban Paediatric Clinic originated as part of a cohort study designed to address the community's need for a dedicated child health service. In 2023, it was integrated into the Department of Community Medicine, further expanding its reach and impact.

Located in Chinna Allapuram, an urban neighbourhood in Vellore, the clinic now serves over 10,000 children, offering clinical care, health education, and research-based interventions.

Beyond disability

The Rehabilitation Institute, founded by Dr. Mary Verghese in 1966, offers comprehensive care for people with spinal cord injuries, neurological disorders, and physical disabilities. It focuses on medical treatment, therapy, and vocational training to restore independence. The department is recognised as a WHO Collaborating Centre for Development of Rehabilitation Technology, Capacity Building and Disability Prevention.

Rehab Mela 2025

Celebrating strength and hope

Rehab Mela 2025 was a special event honouring the birth centenary of Dr. Mary Verghese, the founder of India's first rehabilitation facility, now known as the Mary Verghese Rehabilitation Institute at CMC Vellore. This year's Rehab Mela welcomed 61 acquired brain injury patients and 210 spinal cord injury patients. Over three days, participants took part in medical check-ups, sports, cultural events, health sessions, employment consultations and cybercrime awareness. Highlights included wheelchair races, archery, basketball matches, and evening performances celebrating resilience.

The event, themed 'Fallen to Rise,' concluded with group discussions, health talks, worship, and medical reviews, capturing a message of hope and the ongoing journey of recovery.



Navigating postal paths

Every day, Yuvarani rides four kilometres on her specially designed two-wheeler, skilfully weaving through the winding roads of Palamathi Hills. “I have navigated many curves in life—this is just one of them,” she says.

At 23, her life changed forever. Surgery for tuberculosis left her paralysed from the hip down. Hope returned through CMC Vellore’s Rehab Institute, where she regained confidence, rebuilt her dreams, and began a new chapter. With their support, she also received a customised vehicle from the State Bank of India.

Today, Yuvarani proudly works as a postmaster under the physically handicapped quota. “I am grateful to the Rehab Institute. Now, I navigate everything—from running a post office to the sharp curves of Palamathi Hills and raising my daughter,” she shares.





Mental Health Centre

Waves of healing

The Mental Health Centre provides care for people facing emotional, psychological, and psychiatric challenges. It offers outpatient and inpatient services for children, adolescents, and adults. With a focus on accessible care, the centre brings together clinical treatment, counselling, rehabilitation, and training for mental health professionals. It also supports research and outreach to promote well-being in both rural and urban communities.

Dr. Ida S. Scudder Humanitarian Oration 2024

CMC Vellore and the Vellore CMC Foundation (USA) hosted the annual Dr. Ida S. Scudder Humanitarian Oration on 6th December 2024, honouring individuals who embody compassion and service. Past recipients include Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, Mrs. Sudha Murthy, and Mr. Azim Premji.

Dr. Soumya Swaminathan, former Chief Scientist at the World Health Organization and a leading voice in global health, delivered the 2024 oration. She addressed the topic of equity and access in the context of tuberculosis, highlighting the ongoing global challenges posed by the disease. Drawing on her experience with COVAX and the COVID-19 pandemic, she emphasised the critical need for inclusive and accessible healthcare systems.



Chatram


Comfort corner

Since 1906, Chatram has been a welcoming home just 400 meters from CMC Vellore's Town Campus. It offers patients from distant places a safe and affordable place to stay, all for less than US\$1 a day. Donations from the MBBS Batch of 1970 provide residents with a wholesome meal at the hospital canteen. With additional donor support, we also facilitate lunch or dinner at Chatram, reaching about 30–35 residents daily. In 2024-2025, 298 people, including 80 children from 14 states, found comfort here, supported by weekly chaplain visits and a full-time caretaker who ensures they are never alone in their healing journey.

Little sparks of joy

At Chatram, children facing serious illnesses still find reasons to smile, dream, and hope. The care and support they receive help them feel stronger each day. Their laughter at Chatram fills the air and lifts the spirits of everyone around them. Even during treatments and tough days, they find ways to hold on to joy, reminding us how much hope can grow even in hard times.

CMC Poisons Information Centre

Keeping communities safe



The CMC Poisons Information Centre (CMC PIC) provides a 24/7 free telephone service to support the management of poisoning and envenoming cases across India. It provides guidance on diagnosis, use of antidotes, patient stabilisation, and timely referral, which is especially critical in rural settings, which account for over 60% of calls.

Beyond phone support, the Centre engages in chemical safety education, snakebite prevention, and response to industrial incidents. It also contributes to public health policy and works closely with the Clinical Toxicology Unit at CMC Vellore for patient care.

A notable example comes from Gudipala, a village in Chittoor district. After a resident survived a severe snakebite with intensive care unit (ICU) care at the Town Campus, the PIC team conducted a medical camp in his village.

The PIC team offered education on snakebite prevention and first aid, thereby empowering the community to reduce future risks.



14th Annual Research Day – 2024

The 14th Annual Research Day was held on 24th and 25th October 2024 at Scudder Auditorium and the New Examination Hall, organised by the Office of Research at Christian Medical College Vellore. The event highlighted the breadth of research being undertaken across the institution, featuring contributions from faculty and students in medical and surgical specialities, nursing, pre- and paraclinical sciences, allied health sciences, and research scholars.

Over two days, the programme included 393 poster presentations and 202 podium presentations, reflecting the vibrant and diverse research culture at CMC Vellore.



Research in Action - Chittoor Campus

A new research office was inaugurated on the Chittoor campus in June 2024. Set up in a refurbished container, the space now houses eight research staff working on key community health projects.



Currently, the following research studies are underway:

- **Strengthening Ambulatory Care for NCDs**

An ICMR National Priority Health Research (NPHR) project focused on improving ambulatory care for non-communicable diseases in public health facilities across the Chittoor district.

- **Community-Based Lifestyle Interventions**

A multisite ICMR study in collaboration with Lifestyle Medicine, RUHSA, and Healing Fields (an NGO working in Bihar and Jharkhand), exploring community volunteer models to encourage healthy lifestyle adoption.

- **Integrated Primary Healthcare Delivery**

Supported by the Gates Foundation, this project aims to develop a model for primary healthcare that ensures continuity of care and effective referral pathways.

- **Cancer Awareness in Youth**

A JBI grant-funded initiative focused on increasing awareness about cancer among adolescents and young adults in Chittoor.

- **Evaluating Triage Tools for Rural Women**

This evaluation study, also supported by the Gates Foundation, employs a realist methodology to assess how triage tools influence health-seeking behaviour among women of influence in rural Jharkhand.





Community Health Department (CHAD)

Started in 1955, CHAD includes a training centre, an outpatient clinic, and a secondary care hospital. It offers learning opportunities for medical, nursing, and paramedical students, postgraduates, and staff. Known globally for its research, CHAD also provides healthcare, therapy, health education, and nutrition support to communities in the Kaniyambadi block and the tribal villages of the Jawadhi hills.

In June 2024, CHAD opened a well-equipped endoscopy room, treating nearly 1,300 patients and performing 72 minor procedures. It also resumed audiology services, including neonatal hearing screening, and renewed outreach efforts in Jawadhi village, reinforcing its commitment to community-centred healthcare.

Sewage treatment plant

RUHSA commissioned the sewage treatment plant in November 2024 to manage hospital and residential waste. The campus uses the treated water for gardening and other needs.

Renovated dental clinic

New health programmes

For women and differently-abled individuals, focusing on holistic recovery.
- ***Adolescent and Youth Programme for Mental Health and Substance Use***
Aimed at adolescents aged 12–24, promoting prevention and support.
- ***Elderly Healthcare programme for Lifestyle Disease and Health Aging***
Serving vulnerable seniors in KV Kuppam with geriatric care, nutrition, therapy, and social support. Currently, 110 elders benefit from this programme.

New Course - General Duty Assistant

Launched in September 2023 at RUHSA Community College to offer basic nursing skills to students without formal qualifications. Twenty students completed the course, passed the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) assessment, and moved on to internships and bridge programmes.



Training programmes

RUHSA trained 1,253 students and professionals through 61 programmes, strengthening its role in rural health education.

CONCH, a nurse-led community-based programme established in 1987, delivers quality healthcare to 72,020 people across 25 villages in Vellore and Ranipet. By integrating education, service, training, and research, CONCH meets community health needs and equips nurses with practical, hands-on learning through their work in the villages. To meet growing healthcare needs, CONCH is expanding to five more villages, enhancing access to care and providing practical training for nursing students.

LCECU was established in 1982 to provide healthcare to people in Vellore's low-income neighbourhoods, offering affordable and accessible care close to home.

Community at the core

LCECU covers seven low-income neighbourhoods, providing healthcare support. The addition of an MPH-qualified Outreach Coordinator strengthened the team. Key programmes included the 17th Thiruvizha for individuals with disabilities and the Life Skills Programmes for youth. LCECU also runs the Red Cross Outreach Clinic.

Care for people with tuberculosis

LCECU provided regular home visits to tuberculosis patients, offering both medical follow-up and additional social support. A total of 159 patients have resumed treatment, and 37 additional patients have enrolled in the TB Nutrition programme.

New equipment

In six months, 212 scans were conducted at LCECU using the Point-of-Care Ultrasound machine donated by the Rotary Club of Vellore Fort. Their financial contribution also supported medical procedures for 29 patients.

Education and Training

The Family Medicine Masterclass, held in December 2024, was attended by 28 postgraduate students (PGs) across India.



Building health beyond the clinic

At Shalom Family Medicine Centre, nurse-led education sessions provide patients and families guidance and practical skills needed to manage diabetes as a shared, sustainable lifestyle.



The Department of Ophthalmology

Hope in focus

Established in 1902, the Department of Ophthalmology grew from the Mary Taber Schell Memorial Hospital continuing a legacy of compassionate eye care.

Alumni Spotlight

Paul Harrison Award

This year, Drs. Deepa and Rajiv Choudhrie received CMC Vellore's highest alumni honour for their exceptional service in medicine and public health. They began their journey together as classmates in the MBBS batch of 1982 at CMC Vellore, eventually becoming partners in both profession and life. Their shared path led them to rural Madhya Pradesh, where they have spent decades transforming Padhar Hospital into a vital healthcare centre for thousands.

Padhar is no easy post. Tucked away in the Betul district, it's a tribal region marked by poverty, rugged terrain, and limited access to healthcare. The hospital, founded in 1958 by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in M.P., began modestly and has grown into a 200-bed facility serving patients from Madhya Pradesh and its neighbouring states of Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh.



The Paul Harrison Award, instituted in 1966, honours graduates who embody the college's motto:

“Not to be ministered unto, but to minister.”

Since the early 1990s, they've anchored their work at Padhar Hospital. Dr. Deepa leads the Radiology Department and, as one of the few radiologists in the district, is constantly in demand. Dr. Rajiv, Medical Superintendent since 2008, specialises in Oncoplastic and Microvascular Reconstructive Surgery, but in this rural setting, handles a broad range of surgical needs. Their leadership has strengthened clinical services, medical education, and community outreach, bringing renewed purpose and growth to the hospital.

Today, Padhar Hospital is a multi-speciality centre, treating over 42,000 outpatients annually. It houses a modern operating theatre complex, as well as medical, paediatric, and surgical ICUs and trauma and emergency care units. NABL and NABH accreditations affirm its commitment to quality. Under the Choudhries' stewardship, the hospital has also established key partnerships with organisations such as the Azim Premji Foundation and the Consulate of Japan, securing oxygen plants, diagnostic equipment, and critical funding.

Palliative Care

Nestling care

Palliative Care at CMC Vellore began as a response to the growing need for compassionate, whole-person care for patients with advanced cancer. In India, nearly 70% of cancer cases are diagnosed at a stage when curative treatment is no longer possible. These patients often experience severe physical symptoms and face emotional, social, financial, and spiritual challenges as individuals, caregivers and families.

The Department of Palliative Medicine provides care that goes beyond medical treatment. A multidisciplinary team of doctors, nurses, counsellors, and support staff works together to manage pain, improve quality of life, and support patients and caregivers through difficult times.

Whisper of comfort



Chellammal, in her eighties, was recovering from a spinal fracture after cancer treatment. The team began home visits, managing her pain, providing nursing care, and offering counselling. But she needed more consistent support. She moved to the Ida B. Scudder Hospice, where she finally found comfort and care. Her pain eased, and she felt safe and cared for.

“I came here in pain, with no one to care for me,” she says. “Now, I’m happy, and I can walk without pain. The nurses care for me like my own grandchildren. I’m alive today because of all of you.”



Governance



CMC Vellore is a non-profit organisation governed by the Christian Medical College Vellore Association, registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860. Governance is exercised through the Association's represented members, headed by its officers. The Memorandum of Association, Constitution and by-laws are listed and strictly adhered to. The appointment of officers is made through a Nomination Committee of the Council.


Major Expenses




This rating recognises CMC Vellore's performance, with steady revenues and stable occupancy levels, affirming its financial stability and reliability.

Budding district collector

On 15th August 2024, 13-year-old Mohith found freedom from pain, fear, and uncertainty. A bright 9th grader from Sainathapuram, Vellore, Mohith, was diagnosed with a benign bone tumour in his right forearm. Without urgent surgery, doctors warned, the growth could damage his nerves. The procedure cost ₹70,000, a sum far beyond her mother's reach, a young widow earning ₹6,000 a month in a garment shop.

That's when LCECU stepped in. After a home visit and financial assessment, Mohith's family contributed ₹20,000. Thanks to donors like you, support was mobilised to cover the remaining amount.

The surgery was a success. Mohith recovered quickly. Today, he writes with ease, plays with joy, and dreams big. He wants to become a District Collector.

“My son is smiling again,” his mother says. “Mohith is planning his future. That's the biggest gift we could ever receive.”

Across borders, a shared hope

Daryl and Wendy, long-standing supporters of CMC Vellore from the South Australian Branch of the Australian Friends of Vellore, attended the inauguration of the Hybrid Vascular Operating Theatre at the Ranipet Campus on 29th January 2025. The communications team met them for a brief conversation following the event.

“We’ve been supporting this project for quite a while, so to actually stand inside this operating theatre now—it’s pretty special,” Dr. Daryl began. “Dr. Prabhu had a clear vision for what this Hybrid Vascular Operating Theatre could be. We knew from day one that it wasn’t just about building something high-tech. It was about benefiting patients by reducing pain, making surgeries faster, cutting down infection rates, reducing the length of hospital stays, and improving patient care.”

They remembered how, at first, some people in the Australian medical community were unsure. “A few felt it might be too ambitious for the setting here,” Wendy recalled. “But we believed in Dr. Prabhu’s project and CMC Vellore. With the right support, we knew it could happen, and it would make a real difference.”

“Our role wasn’t huge, mostly advocating for this high-tech project, and donating funds when we could”, Wendy added. “But it meant something to us. It was about being part of something we truly believed in.”
