Department of Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy conducted Annual CME



The Department of Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy, CMC Vellore, conducted its Annual CME titled 'Updates in Dermatology Diagnostics and Therapeutics'. A diagnostic workshop was held on 25th July at Wheeler Hall and across various diagnostic laboratories, featuring sessions on cytogenetics, molecular diagnostics, immunofluorescence, immunohistochemistry, mycology and mycobacteriology diagnostics, serodiagnosis, and flow cytometry. The workshop emphasised an interdisciplinary approach to enhance dermatological care. The CME conducted on 26th July 2025 at the New Examination Hall, focused on emerging therapies, recent updates in the management of psoriasis, atopic dermatitis, infections, immunobullous disorders, hair disorders, and advances in laser therapy and dermatosurgery. The event attracted over 160 delegates from more than 65 medical colleges, and the sessions were livestreamed to mission hospitals. It was accredited with 20 CME credit points by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University. The programme concluded with an engaging intercollegiate dermatology quiz, featuring students from 10 colleges.

The ATLS® course is designed to promote critical thinking, collaboration, and a team-based approach to trauma management. Delivered by certified instructors, the training features a highly interactive format that includes hands-on practice with manikins and simulated patients, fostering active participation and deep engagement with the material.

capabilities and fostering a culture of continuous learning and improvement.

Obituaries

• **Dr. Susan Chachy Jacob** (MBBS batch of 1958) at home in Houston, Passed away on 1st July, 2025. She was born on 11th July 1940 in Kerala, India, and grew up in Hyderabad.

Susan excelled in everything she did whether academic or sports. She did her initial schooling in Hyderabad and her medical education at Christian Medical College, Vellore, India. She was the Chief Prefect, played the organ, and sang in the choir. She got her strong sense of academics and love for study from her mother, Saramma Jacob. She won a state championship in tennis while in Hyderabad. She gained her love of sports from her father, Matteethra George Jacob. As a medical student in CMC she is remembered by friends and classmates as a fun loving friendly person. Susan used to play tennis regularly. She kept in touch with all friends and classmates upto the last phase of her life Susan married Philip (Jacobkutty) over 60 years ago while they were both beginning their careers. Along for wherever the adventure of marriage would take them, Susan followed Jacobkutty to the United Kingdom, where she quickly became a senior resident at the Bristol Royal Infirmary. Susan and Jacobkutty went on to live in New York, where she was one of the first South Asian residents accepted at Albert Einstein Hospital. She went on to complete a specialization in Allergy and Immunology at St. Christopher's Hospital in Philadelphia, before settling in Houston, Texas.

Susan did a Fellowship at Baylor College of Medicine at Texas Children's Hospital in pediatric chest diseases. She was invited to join the academic staff at Baylor where she earned the reputation of being an excellent teacher, advisor, and counselor among the residents and medical students. Susan's career highlights include: being accepted to the American Lung Association, leading committees at Baylor to ensure the proper introduction of medical students to the study of pediatrics, and the opening of her own allergy and immunology medical practice where she helped hundreds of patients at four of her clinics across the greater Houston area. Her patients will always remember her for her kindness and the time she took to listen to them. Susan felt her ability to heal people was her purpose in this life, and she lived and met this purpose throughout her 40+ years of her medical career.

Susan will always be known for doing whatever she could for her family, her generosity for those in the community, a love of debating any issue, knowing her mind, and her commitment to studying the Bible. Susan and Jacobkutty were founding members of St. Mary's Church in Houston, hosting church services in their home until the membership increased to pursue a regular church facility. Susan was also part of the medical mission advisory board for the church. Every Christmas, while she was still able, Susan would get gifts for all the children at St. Mary's, as well as continuing to push for a focus on growing the faith of the younger generation, which was a topic of her keynote address at the Diocesan Family Conference. Her faith is what kept her grounded throughout the challenging last few years as she battled kidney disease and other health issues. She never let her health stop her from participating in Bible studies and continuing to dive deeper into God's Word. Susan also believed strongly in the South Asian voice in the city of Houston. She was the first female president of the India Culture Center Organization where she strove to make changes and provide resources to assist a growing Indian community. She was also a member of the Indo-American Political Action Committee. She never shied away from voicing what she thought was the right thing to do!

Family and friends from around the world always knew that if they needed a place to stay, advice, or just a listening ear, Susan always kept the doors and her heart open for them. Susan left us with many memories like amazing parties full of music, laughing with her sister, Nirmala, a house always filled with guests and love, and many more memories and warm feelings that will live in our hearts. Just short of her 85th birthday in July, Susan lived a full life of service as a physician, wife, mother, grandmother, and friend to many.

She will be greatly missed by all who knew her. She is survived by her husband K. Philip Jacob, her children: Philip C. Jacob (Melanie), Mariam Jacob, Sara de Groot (Jeff), and grandchildren: George Chirapurath, Sarah Chirapurath, Saranya Jacob, Ana de Groot, Alexander Vikram Jacob, Ryker de Groot; and her siblings: Nirmala Jacob and Matteethra Jacob. She was laid to rest on 21st July 2025 in her hometown of Vikarabad, and her life will be celebrated at a Memorial service on 26th July, 2025. Dr. Mrudula was born on 18th November 1963 in Bellampally, Telangana, into a household of educators. Her father, the late Rev. E.S Rajabhushanam, an ordained Minister in the Methodist Church, retired as Principal of Methodist Boys' High School and her mother, the late Ms. Shobha Rani retired as Principal of Stanley Girls' Junior College in Hyderabad.



Dr. Mrudula was inspired by their example of religious scholarship, excelling academically. During her high school years, Dr. Mrudula met the love of her life, Mr. Prashanth Kumar, brother of her close friend, now an investment banker. Prashanth became an honorary member of the Batch of '83, attending all campus events and celebrations, and they were married at the start of the internship year. In college, Dr. Mrudula was known for her speedy saree draping skills, with her room a hub for frantic classmates, trying to make the 'early bus' to the Hospital. Her calm smile, unfailing equanimity, quirky sense of humour and fierce loyalty made her a cherished and lifelong friend. Her hospitality was legendary, with large gatherings hosted at her farmhouse. Dr. Mrudula completed her bond at Crawford Memorial Hospital, Vikarabad, and had a flourishing private practice before entering Government service in Andhra Pradesh (now Telangana). Realising the need for specialised obstetric care, she decided to interrupt her service to undertake postgraduate training in OB/ Gyn, obtaining an MS from Osmania University. Although she had multiple opportunities to move away, she chose to remain in her hometown, caring for her community. She served in a variety of primary health care and Government hospital settings, creatively utilising her expertise and surgical skills for the benefit of the underserved, until her retirement in November 2024. Dr. Mrudula's commitment and dedication were exemplary. Even during the COVID pandemic, and in the face of her own significant health challenges, she rarely missed work. She made a heroic effort to attend the 40th Batch Reunion, participating in all activities with her usual zest and enthusiasm. Her fortitude, resilience and uncomplaining endurance remain an inspiration. Dr. Mrudula touched many lives with her empathy and quiet heroism. She will be missed greatly by Mr. Prashanth, her rock and soulmate, her younger brothers William and Pramod, countless friends, colleagues, and relatives the world over, and by the multitudes whose suffering she eased with her skills and compassion.
