



# Rapid response, round the clock

Launched in July 2024, CMC Vellore's Emergency Medical Service (EMS) provides swift, life-saving transport for trauma, stroke, and cardiac emergencies.

Eight ambulances, coordinated 24/7, enable timely transfers across the Town, Ranipet, and Bagayam campuses, with plans to extend to the Chittoor campus.

# Specialised care for young minds

The Paediatric Neurology Unit sees over 26,000 children annually. It provides advanced diagnostics, precision therapies, and interventions such as bone marrow transplants for rare conditions like adrenoleukodystrophy and metachromatic leukodystrophy, as well as surgery for drug-resistant epilepsy. It works closely with psychiatry, rehab, and ICU teams to provide coordinated care.

The unit also offers accredited training for paediatric neurologists and conducts clinical research, including global trials on rare and complex neurological diseases.

#### Advancing vascular surgery

A new hybrid vascular operating theatre, opened in 2025, combines real-time imaging with surgical care, enabling doctors to manage complex heart and vascular cases with greater precision and safety.

#### A dedicated centre for children

Opening in 2026, the 350-bed Paediatric Speciality Centre will offer high-quality, affordable care to underserved children. It is supported by Fairfax Financial Holdings Ltd., Quess Corp, and Ajit Isaac.

#### Supporting tobacco-free futures

The Tobacco Cessation Centre, launched by the Union Minister of Health, provides personalised counselling, medication, and ongoing support to help individuals quit tobacco.

### Pushing boundaries in lung research

The Pulmonary Medicine Research Lab is developing fast, accurate TB tests for rural clinics and advancing new treatments for asthma, COPD, and ILD.

A specialised cell-culture unit is advancing research into lung repair and fibrosis, aiming to improve the quality of life for people with chronic lung conditions.

#### Bringing restful sleep within reach

The new Sleep Clinic, featuring a Level 1 Sleep Lab, delivers individualised diagnosis and treatment for sleep disorders such as apnea and insomnia.

#### Tailored care for allergy and asthma

The Allergy, Asthma & Immunology Clinic utilises precise skin testing to guide targeted, effective treatment strategies.



# A journey of care: 125 years and counting

In 1900, a young woman answered midnight knocks on her door and later walked through the dusty lanes of Vellore with medicine and mercy: the young woman, Dr. Ida Scudder, ignited a movement, not just a hospital. And 125 years later, that flame still glows.

The 125th milestone year unfolded not with grand fanfare but with humility and purpose. A blood donation drive in the heart of town. Eye camps where sight was restored with a gentle touch. Lectures that echoed wisdom across generations. And a sports mela where wheelchairs raced not against each other, but towards dignity.

One hundred and twenty-five years later, CMC Vellore still walks towards the knock on the door.

This year marked a renewal and strengthening of CMC Vellore's commitment to our local communities, who have supported us for 125 years.

Nearly 3,000 lives were touched through endocrinology camps offering medical care for diabetes and thyroid, in addition to diabetic footwear to prevent complications; eye camps that 'reframed' futures by providing both vision and vital health awareness as well as anti-tobacco, anti-obesity, and cardiac camps that delivered screenings, counselling, and hope for healthier futures.

#### Core strength

CONCH integrates education, service, training, and research, providing hands-on learning for nursing students while deeply embedding care into the communities it serves.

#### Expansion

CONCH is growing to include five more villages, aiming to enhance healthcare access and student nurse training.

#### Key initiatives

- Kannigapuram clinic: serves 1,200 people, offering screenings, procedures, referrals, and community health promotion
- Women's empowerment: offers skills training (fabric painting, tie-dye, soap-making) to promote financial independence
- Blood donation awareness: engages local youth to encourage life-saving donations
- First aid training: prepares residents for emergencies, especially in highway-adjacent villages
- Kilminnel clinic: staffed by a resident nurse, treats 572 patients and focuses on maternal, child, and elderly care
- Geriatric club: a social-medical support hub for elderly members offering health checks, exercises, and emotional support


