Scudder Humanitarian Oration at CMC Vellore on 24th September 2025. Speaking to an attentive audience in the Scudder Auditorium and thousands joining via livestream, Dr. Kannan shared his journey of transforming cancer care in rural Assam, highlighting the importance of equity, compassion, and innovation in medicine.

### 125 Years of CMC Vellore 1900-2025





#### **8 November 1922:**

The Senatus resolved that College Day would be celebrated every year on the founder's birthday, December 9. The programme for College Day included tree planting in the morning, sports in the afternoon, and dinner in the evening.

Dr. Ravi Kannan spoke of the challenges of reaching patients in rural communities and the importance of creating systems that serve those most in need, reminding the audience that 'healthcare is not a privilege, it is a right, and every patient deserves dignity and access'. He emphasised that true progress in medicine lies not only in advanced technology but also in practical, compassionate solutions that make treatment accessible and affordable for the poor, noting that innovation is not about machines alone; it is about finding ways to reach the unreached.

He urged young doctors and health professionals to look beyond the walls of hospitals, saying, "We cannot wait for people to come to us—we must take care where they live." He concluded with a call to carry forward Dr. Ida Scudder's vision of service and equity in healthcare. He was accompanied by his wife, Mrs. Seethalakshmi, whose quiet strength and compassion have been at the heart of Dr. Kannan's remarkable journey and mission. The Oration, jointly organised by Christian Medical College Vellore and the US-based Vellore CMC Foundation, aims to perpetuate the legacy of CMC's founder, Ida Scudder, by honouring individuals who exemplify her courage and compassion, integrity and character, to inspire future generations to follow in her footsteps and emulate her dedication to the well-being of humanity.



CMC Director, Dr, Vikram Mathews, al & Research welcomed the gathering, inviting CMC's Council Chair, Mrs. Anuvinda Varkey, onto the stage to honour our guest with the traditional 'ponnadai'. Dr. Raj Narayan, chair of the Vellore CMC Foundation, New York, read the Citation and introduced the speaker. Dr Susan Taylor, a Board member of the VCMC Foundation, presented the Citation to Dr Ravi Kannan. The vote of thanks was given by Dr. Solomon Satishkumar, Principal of the Christian Medical College Vellore.

After the Oration, Dr Ravi Kannan visited some of CMC's campuses, interacting with staff and students from the Departments of Gynaecology and Oncology, Transfusion Medicine and Blood Bank, LCECU, CHAD, Rehab, and RUHSA.



# Report of the first National Nursing Conference of College of Nursing, CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus, Chittoor



The first National Nursing Conference of the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus, titled "Optimising Adolescence: Assess, Act and Appraise" was organised on 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> September, 2025. Rev. Finney Alexander, Head of Chaplaincy, offered a short devotion and prayer. Mrs. Nirmala Margaret P, Principal, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus, delivered a welcome address and introduced the Chief Guest.

Mrs. Shimy Mathew, the Secretary, Nurses League of the Christian Medical Association of India, was the Chief Guest and delivered a keynote address. She highlighted the salient characteristics of the adolescent period and the need to be sensitive to the needs of adolescents. She mentioned the topic chosen for the Conference was highly relevant and need-based in the current societal context. Prof. Shandrila Gnanatheebam, Dean, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, Prof. Sonia P Abraham, Deputy Nursing Superintendent, and Dr. Uday Zachariah, Associate Director, CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus, offered felicitations. Mrs. Anbarasi S, Organising Secretary, gave an overview of the conference. Dr. Pastin Pushpa Rani P, Organising Secretary, delivered the vote of thanks. The Inaugural session came to an end with the National Anthem.

Scientific sessions commenced with the plenary session I on 'understanding the adolescents', chaired by Mrs. Nirmala Margaret, the Principal, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus. The first speaker of the session was Dr. Vinitha Ravindran, former Dean, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, who spoke on "Bio Psycho Social Dimensions of Adolescents". She emphasised the biological and psychological influences on adolescents.

The second talk on "Emerging Chronicity" was given by Dr. Cibi Jose, Principal, Sri Venkateswara Nursing College, Chennai. She highlighted the magnitude of chronic problems in adolescents and the preventive approaches. The third topic was on "Healthy Sexuality" by Dr. Reshmi, Associate Professor, Department of Paediatrics, CMC Vellore. She demystified the concepts related to reproductive health and sexuality. Plenary session II on 'invisible to visible' was chaired by Dr. Mary Anabarasi Johnson, Professor and Former HOD, Child Health Nursing, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore. Dr. Satya Raj, Professor and Head, Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Unit, CMC Vellore, spoke on "Triumph Over Trauma – A path of Healing".

The second topic on "Art of Resilience" was dealt with by Dr. Manoranjitham S, The Former Professor and HOD, Psychiatric Nursing, CMC Vellore, and the third was on "Government Initiative for Adolescent Issues" by Mrs. N Uma Maheshwari, Superintendent, Department of Children Welfare and Special Services. Plenary session III was chaired by Prof. Shandrila Gnanatheebam, the Dean College of Nursing, CMC Vellore. The first topic, "Eating Disorders", was by Dr. Reshmi YS, Associate Professor, Department of Paediatrics, CMC Vellore. She emphasised the clinical presentation of clients with eating disorders and the measures to manage them. The second topic was "Addiction Free Adolescents", dealt with by Dr. Dheeraj Kattula, Professor and Acting HOD (Unit II), Department of Psychiatry, CMC Vellore. The third topic on "Nurturing Healthy Practices" was done by Dr. Dhanalakshmi, Student Counsellor, Department of Student Welfare, VIT, Vellore.

She practically demonstrated Deep Breathing and Mindfulness to the audience/delegates. The final session on "Research and Innovations" was done by Dr. Radhakrishnan Govindan, Additional Professor, Department of Nursing, Consultant - Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, NIMHANS, Bangalore. He highlighted various research projects implemented for the mental health of adolescents.

Poster presentations and scientific paper presentations were planned on day 1. The evaluators were Prof. Lilly Prasad, Professor & HOD, Child Health Nursing, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore and Dr. Cibi Jose, Principal, Sri Venkateswara Nursing College Chennai, Prof. Santhi Lithiya, Professor & HOD, Psychiatric Nursing, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore and by Dr. Mary Anabarasi Johnson, Professor and Former HOD, Child Health Nursing, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore.

On day 2, a panel discussion was planned on "Balancing the Imbalance: Does Today's curriculum address Adolescents' Holistic needs?", moderated by Dr. Radhika M, Associate Professor, IGIMS College of Nursing, Patna. The panellists were Dr. Hepsi Bai, Assistant Professor, AIIMS, Bhubaneshwar, Dr. Janarthanan, Tutor, JIPMER Pondicherry, Ms. Esther Kanthi and Mrs. Aruna, Associate Professors from College of Nursing, CMC Vellore. They highlighted the need for Holistic Development of Adolescents, the insights from NEP and Opportunities and Challenges for providing Holistic Education for adolescents. Day one of the conference concluded with a cultural event by the Student Nurses Association of the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus.

The conference was attended by 85 delegates from 8 different states in the country. The valedictory programme was conducted on September 12, 2025. Dr. P. Hemagiri Kumari, Principal, Sri Padmavathamma Govt. College of Nursing, Tirupati, was the Chief Guest. She, being the APNMC-appointed CNE Observer, gave her remarks about the conference and wished the College of Nursing to organise many such events to strengthen the standard of the Nursing profession in the state and country. Rev. Deepak Gnanaprakash, Chaplain, CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus, offered the prayers. Dr. Pastin Pushpa Rani P, Organising Secretary, presented the report of the conference. # Cookery Competition on "Diabetic Dinner – Conquering the Night Cravings" Organised by the Department of Endocrinology, CMC Vellore

The Department of Endocrinology, CMC Vellore, hosted a vibrant cookery competition themed "Diabetic Dinner – Conquering the Night Cravings" on the evening of 27<sup>th</sup> September, 2025. The event was an exciting confluence of culinary innovation and health awareness, aimed at promoting diabetic-friendly dietary practices among the community of Vellore. The event was presided over by Dr. Khushboo Agarwal, Assistant Professor, Department of Endocrinology and Metabolism, CMC Vellore. The Chief Guest for the evening was Dr. Lallu Joseph, Associate General Superintendent, CMC, Ranipet Campus. In her address, Dr. Lallu Joseph emphasised the importance of a balanced plate and portion control, and expressed her appreciation for the enthusiastic participation of the public.

The concept of a "Diabetic Dinner" focuses on meals that are:

- Rich in complex carbohydrates, lean proteins, healthy fats, and fibre
- Based on low glycaemic index ingredients to avoid blood sugar spikes
- Made using wholesome foods such as millets, legumes, leafy greens, and fresh fruits (in moderation). Prepared through healthy cooking techniques like steaming, grilling, or sautéing
- Served with mindful portion control, especially important for nighttime meals.

The theme "Conquering the Night Cravings" was selected to highlight a common challenge among diabetic individuals—late evening hunger. The goal was to encourage smart, nutritious dinner options that not only satisfy cravings but also support optimal blood sugar control overnight.

A total of 35 teams enthusiastically participated in the competition.

**Mr. Mayuranathan D,** father of Dr. Thiyagaraj Mayuranathan, Scientist, Centre for Stem Cell Research, passed away on 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2025. Let us uphold all the bereaved family members in our prayers.

**Dr. Katy Driver Radhakrishnan** (MBBS batch of 1956) passed away on 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2025. Surrounded by family and friends, Dr. Katy Driver Radhakrishnan (DCH, Am.Bd of Paed., FRCP(C), FAAP), passed away peacefully at the age of 86 on July 3, 2025, at Sunnybrook Hospital, Toronto. Katy was born on October 16, 1938, in Mumbai, India, to Zoroastrian parents, Mr. Faredoonji and Mrs. Mehra Driver. The younger of two children and their only daughter, she grew up learning the principles of good Parsi homemaking from her mother. Even as a very young girl, however, Katy knew that she wanted to become a doctor and was determined to pursue a path beyond traditional expectations.



With the encouragement of her elder brother, Jimmy, she accepted an offer to study at the prestigious Christian Medical College (CMC) in Vellore - a choice that shaped the rest of her life. Her years at CMC were formative both personally and professionally. She excelled in her studies, forged lifelong friendships, and embraced a "work hard, play hard" mantra that remained with her always.

She often reflected with gratitude on the opportunities CMC afforded, and maintained close ties with classmates and alumni around the world. It was at Vellore that Katy met her future husband, Dr. M. A. Radhakrishnan ("Radha") (PG alumnus, Anaesthesia). On the surface, the two were seemingly polar opposites. Radha, a Hindu, was the quiet, reserved anesthesiology resident; Katy, a Zoroastrian, the more outgoing pediatric trainee. Despite coming from different faiths and personalities, their love blossomed, supported wholeheartedly by their accepting families. The couple moved to Canada to complete their medical training, with fellowships that took them from Halifax to Montreal to Vancouver. Katy quickly fell in love with Canada - its natural beauty, welcoming spirit, and institutions built on openness and fairness. Their time training in Montreal opened Katy's eyes to a life that she knew she needed to pursue.

She and Radha married in Montreal in 1965 and welcomed their "Expo baby", Meena, in 1967. Their Canadian training complete, Katy was determined that a return to India would be bounteous, but brief. A son, Shyam (Sam), was born in Mumbai in 1968. While Radha was content to set up a sinecure practice in the pastoral beauty of the Kerala backwaters, Katy was adamant that they seek the greater opportunities that a return to Canada could afford. In 1972, the family moved to Toronto; Katy, to begin on staff at the Hospital for Sick Children, and Radha, at Mount Sinai Hospital.

For her young family, life in Toronto was everything Katy had envisioned. She and Radha's careers flourished, such that they moved to the nicest neighborhoods while sending their children to the best of Toronto's private schools. Their social circle rapidly enlarged beyond just work friends, as an initial small nucleus of like-minded South Asian professionals grew into a large and close-knit support group of multiple families of varied faiths and backgrounds. This extended family of 'uncles and aunties' would faithfully meet most weekends to enjoy each other's company and trade stories; the men sipping their scotch, the ladies cream soda, while the young children played board games together into the wee hours of the night.

Katy's life together with Radha was tragically cut short when in 1983 Radha died after a battle with cancer. Katy's resilience and the unwavering support of her close-knit circle of friends, carried her forward. She devoted herself to raising her children, modeling values of hard work, compassion, and service; a role she fulfilled as the benevolent matriarch of her family across two generations. The turn of the millennium bore full witness to the fruits of these efforts: Meena married Richard in a story book ceremony at Casa Loma (2000), and Sam wed Johanna in a picturesque outdoor setting (2002). Precious grandchildren Maya (2001), Sara (2002), Nigel (2004) and Sophia (2006) soon followed to be doted on by 'Grammy' and loved with justifiable pride as they blossomed into talented young adults.

Professionally, Katy's career spanned more than six decades in pediatrics. She was deeply committed to caring for "her kids" and known for her compassion, availability, and dedication to families. She also loved teaching and mentoring, hosting journal clubs in her home and inspiring hundreds of medical students, residents, and fellows.

A pioneer in child protection, she worked alongside Dr. Robert Bates to establish one of the first Child Protection Services teams at SickKids. This extended Katy's service to vulnerable children, and for years the two undertook alternate 24-hour call shifts to ensure the project's viability and impact.

Her stature as a leading medical expert also provided opportunities to sit on numerous Boards of Directors for institutions as varied as daycares, centres for youth, professional society advisory panels and even the LCBO. Medicine was so core to her sense of self-worth and duty that even at the age of 80, during the COVID pandemic, gowned in layers of personal protection equipment while using her walker to ambulate, she still took shifts at a local pediatric clinic. When the time came to finally and formally retire, emotionally spent and incapable of crafting the letter herself, it was with tearful resignation that she enlisted her son to the task of informing the College.

Outside medicine, Katy lived with equal energy and generosity. She enjoyed a number of hobbies including knitting, sewing, reading and travelling, and even took up campaigning for her preferred provincial political candidates. In loving homage to her Zoroastrian faith, she was deeply involved in the Toronto and Ontario Parsi communities, taking on leadership, fundraising and volunteer roles.

In 1996, she was presented with the Jamshed Pavri Humanitarian Service Award from the Federation of Zoroastrian Associations of North America, and in 2007, the Lifetime Award from the Zoroastrian Society of Ontario (ZSO) for her years of dedicated service.

It was during a tour to Iran, the birthplace of Zoroastrianism, in 2000, that Katy forged her friendship with another Parsi widow, Betty. The two became inseparable soul sisters for the last quarter century of Katy's life. Beyond being socially active and travelling the world together, they faithfully cared for and lovingly supported each other through life's challenges and shared in each other's triumphs.

The pair were affectionately known as 'The Grammies' by her family and close circle of friends, and Katy assuredly left her earthly time in full confidence that her family would still have the indefatigable Betty to love and cherish.

Katy will be remembered as a devoted daughter, sister, wife, mother, grandmother, physician, role-model and friend. She embodied the Zoroastrian principles of "Good Thoughts, Good Words, Good Deeds," living with generosity, humour, and love. Her presence enriched every life she touched, and her legacy will live on through her family, her patients, and her community.
