The 18th Annual Students Mission Conference - SHILOH 2025, was conducted at the Christian Medical College Vellore in partnership with Christian Medical Association of India, Emmanuel Hospital Association, The Leprosy Mission Trust India and Evangelical Medical Fellowship of India at the Scudder Auditorium, Bagayam from 2nd to 5th October 2025. In this momentous year of the 125th anniversary of the institution, the key verse, “Looking unto Jesus, the Author and Finisher of our faith...” (Hebrews 12.2), highlighted the conference theme, “**Be Thou My Vision**”. This theme was chosen to challenge participants to a greater purpose and vision in life, having the Lord Jesus Christ as our focus, and to dedicate our lives to fulfilling His plans in obedience to His commands.

Shiloh is a movement committed to nurturing the spiritual growth of young students and graduates and inspiring them to become leaders in Christ’s healing ministry. It offers a platform for students to explore and engage with Christian healthcare missions both in India and across the world. This year, about 1400 participants (including medical, nursing, allied health students and faculty) from across the country congregated at CMC Vellore to listen to a plethora of resource personnel ranging from leaders in Christian missions to healthcare professionals and administrators, as well as young professionals from the mission field.

The **Mission Presentations** at Shiloh 2025 offered a panoramic view of the Christian healthcare work and witness covering a spectrum of rural, urban missions and government set-up. Mr. Ashish Daniel (GEMS Mission Hospital, Bihar), Dr. Arun Kumar Budha (Green Pastures Hospital, Nepal), Dr. Arun Immanuel & Dr. Catherine Immanuel (CSI Mission Hospital, Trichy), Ms. Josin Sheba (Madhepura Christian Hospital), Mr. Shankar Ramachandran (Kachhwa Christian Hospital), Dr. Chering Choden Tenzing (District Hospital Mangan, Sikkim), Dr Keerthi Pratyusha Pusala (Christian Hospital Bissamcuttack) and Mr. Paramjit Singh & Mrs Vinakshi Singh (Herbertpur Christian Hospital) shared vivid and heartfelt accounts of their experiences—portraying both the joys and the challenges of serving in diverse and challenging contexts. Their real-life stories were a testament to the impact of mission hospitals and an inspiration to students.

In his address, the Director, Dr. Vikram Matthews, emphasised that Shiloh was a pause in the long-distance race of our life to instil dedication and commitment to a Christ-centred lifestyle. Dr. Jachin Velavan, Associate Director (Missions), shared about the Mentorship programme- 'Connect One-on-One', which provides a unique opportunity for students to journey their professional and spiritual lives along with a mentor. The group discussions allowed participants to share and learn from one another in small groups led by faculty.

The **Rev. Dr John Scudder I Oration** is a highlight of Shiloh, celebrating the life and legacy of Dr. John Scudder I, the first medical missionary from the United States of America to India and the grandfather of Dr Ida Scudder. This year, the prestigious oration was awarded to **Dr. Isaac Jebaraj** and **Dr. Prasanna Jebaraj** in recognition of their exemplary and selfless service in the healthcare field as witnesses to the healing ministry of Christ. During the oration, they both testified as to how the Lord Jesus is the Grand Weaver who beckons us to different areas of need, resulting in life-changing stories.

Breakout sessions addressed the everyday challenges to give a Biblical perspective and practical tips to overcome challenges and to make wise decisions. The sessions were led by Mr. Jonathan Abraham (Breaking free: Vision and provision during temptations and challenges), Mr. Shanker Ramachandran (God's vision for my career: Discovering purpose and calling), Dr. Leishiwon & Dr. Adeline Sither (The Saline Taster: Partnering in God's Vision as His witnesses), Rev. Kabod and Mrs Gloria (God's vision for Marriage "Forever Yours"- Will you prepare or repair), Mr. Charles Premkumar (Christian Apologetics: Reasons for God) and Dr. Asha Prabha (Social Media and Screen time: Cultivating God's Vision in a Distracted World). Representatives from **CMAI, TLM, EHA, EMFI, and HCFI** gave insightful presentations on their work in underserved areas across India.





Shiloh 2025 featured a series of impactful special sessions titled "Vision, Vocation, and Voyage" by **Dr. M.C. Matthew**, urging participants to embrace the call of "Be Thou My Vision" and walk with Christ to become who they are called to be. **Mr. Nidhi Koshy** shared his inspiring testimony, "The Three Jolts of My Life," reflecting on his journey from the corporate world to following God's calling. A new highlight was the panel discussion "Heart Talk," led by a dynamic team of young graduates from **CMC** and other institutions, who shared their student journeys and mission hospital experiences and how those experiences have influenced their lives.

Another exciting feature of this conference was a brilliant play, "**Facing Lions**" by Open House Productions, written and directed by Ms. Shekina Jacob, bringing to life the transformative power of the Holy spirit. This was followed by the screening of the *documentary*, "**Be Thou My Vision**", unveiling the early life of Dr. Ida Scudder.

The **UNARV band** led by Mr. Cherry George engaged the audience in an incredible time of interactive worship that proved to be memorable. The students participated in the much-anticipated Bible Quiz with great enthusiasm. We hope this inspires many to read and learn the Word of God more in the coming days. The final day of Shiloh 2025 had a *community service* led by the Chaplaincy team, followed by an engaging *Question & Answer session* with a team of experienced panellists from the resource team.

PG Shiloh was conducted in the afternoon of the final day designed specifically for the interns, postgraduates and fellows to encourage them on their demanding journey as a postgraduate, challenge and expose them to healthcare needs across the country. This year the speakers were Dr. Gnanaraj & Dr. Sheena (Duncan Christian Hospital, Raxaul), Mrs. Ben Naro (CFH, Oddanchatram), Dr. Elsa John (Sewa Bhavan Hospital, Jagadeeshpur).

Inauguration of Medium Cost Private Ward at Mental Health Centre



The Medium Cost Private Ward of the Department of Psychiatry was inaugurated in a virtual ceremony on the 10th of October 2025, in the New Examination Hall, Bagayam Campus, by Dr. Jitendra Singh, Hon'ble Union Minister of State (IC) of Ministry of Science & Technology and Ministry of Earth Sciences; Minister of State for PMO; Ministry of Personnel & Public Grievances and Pensions, Department of Atomic Energy and Department of Space, Government of India.

The programme commenced with a prayer by Rev Dr. Finney Alexander. This was followed by the welcome address by Dr. Rajesh Gopalakrishnan, Head of the Department of Psychiatry. Dr. Vikram Mathews, Director, introduced the Chief Guest and Dr. Rajesh I, Medical Superintendent, provided a brief overview of the Mental Health Centre and the services provided at the department.

Inauguration of APERT at CMC Vellore – A Step Forward in Thrombosis Care

On October 16, 2025, in observance of "World Thrombosis Day", the Acute Pulmonary Embolism Response Team (APERT) was officially dedicated at CMC Vellore. APERT was an initiative led by the Medical Superintendent's office to foster multidisciplinary management of acute pulmonary embolism, aiming to provide rapid, coordinated, and evidence-based care.

The event commenced with a prayer song by the Pulmonary Medicine team, followed by a warm welcome and introduction by Mrs. Reena Rachel George, Associate Nursing Superintendent. Esteemed dignitaries graced the inauguration: Dr. Dheepak Selvaraj, Associate Director, Dr. Prabhu Premkumar, Associate Medical Superintendent. Key representatives extended special felicitation from various departments: Dr. Aparna Irodi (Professor, Radiodiagnosis), Dr. Anoop George Alex (Professor, Cardiology), Dr. Richa Gupta (Professor & HOD, Respiratory Medicine), Dr. Barney Isaac (Professor & HOD, Pulmonary Medicine), Dr. Jesu Kripa (Deputy Director, QMC). The event was moderated by Dr. Aswith, Assistant Professor, Pulmonary Medicine, and concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Balamugesh T, Associate Medical Superintendent. A closing prayer was offered by Rev. Vijay Kumar, bringing the ceremony to a meaningful end.

Hospitalised patients are at higher risk of developing deep vein thrombosis and pulmonary embolism. To improve the knowledge and skills, nursing services prepared educational materials on pulmonary embolism and thrombosis and these were made available on the CMC intranet. An e-quiz was also hosted online, designed to reinforce key concepts related to prevention and early recognition of thrombosis and pulmonary embolism. As of October 18, 2025, over 700 participants have completed the quiz, with e-certificates issued for their participation. Additionally, 2 educational stalls were set up at the Ranipet campus, featuring models and informative posters. These stalls attracted significant attention and served as a platform for raising awareness among the public, healthcare professionals and students.

In a demonstration of APERT's immediate impact, two clinical cases were discussed during the Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) meeting held on the same day. Collaborative treatment decisions were made, reflecting the team's commitment to timely and effective patient care.

The launch of APERT is a testament to CMC Vellore's dedication to excellence in clinical care and its proactive approach to tackling life-threatening conditions like pulmonary embolism.

International Snakebite Awareness Day 2025



The 8th International Snakebite Awareness Day was observed by the CMC Poison Control Centre on September 19, 2025. The day marked the culmination of year-long activities that were organised to increase awareness about snakebite prevention and appropriate first aid amongst communities in and around Vellore.

Over the past year, visits to villages, schools, and colleges have trained 3,695 people in snakebite prevention and first aid and have reached close to 30,000.

The Annual Snakebite Survivors' Meet was held as a virtual session in Tamil and Telugu for patients who had been admitted to CMC with snakebite over the past year. The meet is a forum for participants to share their personal experiences of dealing with the consequences of a snakebite with others who may have been similarly affected. It also provides an opportunity to reinforce snakebite prevention and appropriate first aid and importantly, empower snakebite victims to be peer educators in their own communities.

A poster competition for school and college students and medical professionals was organised on the topic “Climate change and snakebite mitigation – challenges and solutions”. In the category for school students, the first prize was awarded to Ramya M, the second prize to Praneetha B. and Rakshini D, and the third prize to Likithraj.S, Reshmi V and Rashika S. In the staff and college student category, the first prize was awarded to Mubarak Ali.N, the second prize to Evangelin Celcy R and the third prize to Vishali S.

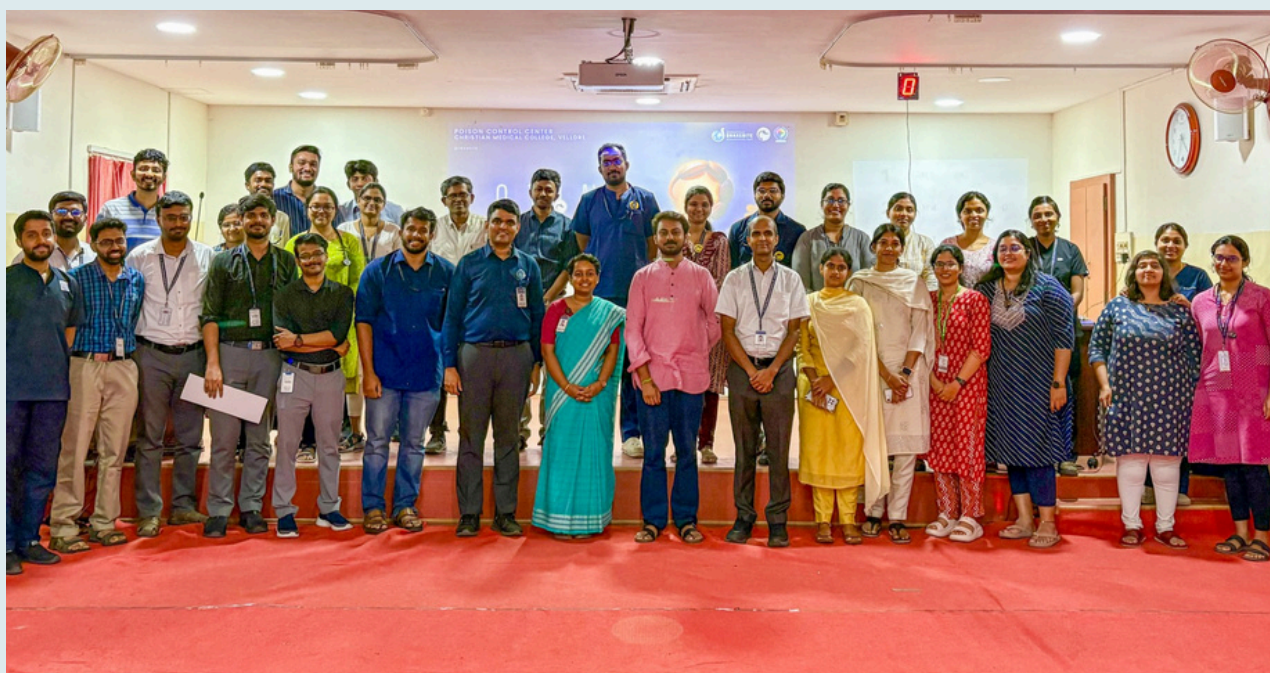
“STING 2025”, the postgraduate quiz on toxinology and snakebite mitigation, was conducted to sensitise medical postgraduates to the field of toxinology. Sixteen teams from various medical colleges participated. The chief guest was Mr. Gnaneswar, Lead of the Snakebite Mitigation Project at the Madras Crocodile Bank Trust. The first prize was awarded to Dr. Tom Antony and Dr. Shrikanth ER (CMC, Vellore), the second prize to Dr. Ramit Kundu and Dr. Hafeezur Rahman (CMC, Vellore) and the third prize to Dr. Kirthika V. and D. Swathi (Chengalpattu Medical College).

The International Snakebite Awareness Day was commemorated with a programme which was graced by Dr. David Mathew (Deputy Medical Superintendent), Dr. Samuel George Hansdak (Head, Department of Medicine), Mrs. Sophia Lawrence (HoU, Medical Nursing) and Rev Lipok (Chaplain). The guests addressed the gathering, highlighting the problem of snakebite envenoming and the need to increase community awareness about prevention and first aid.

A series of stalls was organised to educate the public on snakebite prevention and appropriate first aid. Hands-on demonstration of limb immobilisation, interactive games, a puppet show and the screening of videos in the regional languages were the methods used to create awareness.

It is hoped that these activities would play a role in creating awareness regarding snakes and snakebite prevention and appropriate first aid among the public and the medical community, and be a step towards mitigating snakebite-related deaths and disability in the country.

The 4th Foundation and Preparatory Course in Critical Care



The Department of Critical Care conducted the 4th Foundation and Preparatory Course in Critical Care from October 9th to 11th October 2025. The faculty comprised expert clinicians and renowned educators in Critical Care Medicine from across India. Similar to last year's third iteration, this year's preparatory workshop—primarily designed for exam-going DrNB/DM Critical Care Medicine trainees—was held alongside the foundation course, which catered mainly to first-year trainees.

A total of 41 trainees from critical care super-speciality programs across the country attended the course.

The event was inaugurated with the traditional lighting of the lamp by dignitaries, including Dr. Uday Zachariah, Rev. Mr. Vijayakumar, Dr. J. V. Peter, and Dr. Binila Chacko. The inaugural message emphasised the workshop's core objective: equipping participants with the skills to apply critical care knowledge effectively for better patient management, while considering the patient's family and institutional resources.

The first day focused on the overall approach to managing critically ill patients. Hands-on stations and interactive discussions on systematic approaches to shock and respiratory failure were highly appreciated by the delegates.

The second day began with insightful sessions on critically appraising randomised controlled trials (RCTs) and meta-analyses, followed by nutrition in critically ill patients. Trauma management sessions included hands-on stations on POCUS in trauma, difficult airway management, and ICD insertion. In the afternoon, long and short case presentations were held in the Neuro ICU and Trauma ICU, covering cases from Neurotrauma and Neurology to postoperative Surgical Critical Care.

The final day featured long and short case presentations in the Medical ICU at the Ranipet campus, with engaging discussions on cases from haematology, nephrology, pulmonology, and gastroenterology. This was followed by an interactive session on communication in the ICU, led by an external faculty member.

Esteemed external faculty who assessed delegates and provided valuable feedback included: Dr. Sumit Ray (Holy Family Hospital, New Delhi); Dr. Amarja Havaladar (St. John's Hospital, Bangalore) and Dr. Ramesh Venkatraman (Apollo Hospital, Chennai)

In addition, the workshop benefited from the guidance of Dr. George John, Dr. J. V. Peter, Dr. Binila Chacko, Dr. Kishore Pichamuthu, Dr. Shalini Nair, and Dr. Shoma Rao, who helped delegates refine their case presentation skills and exam readiness.

Throughout the three days, the sessions were interspersed with challenging OSCEs. The course concluded with an exciting quiz competition.

World Occupational Therapy Day 2025

Celebrating world Occupational Therapy Day- 27th of October, 2025

What is Occupational Therapy?

Occupational therapy (OT) uses everyday activities to help people of all ages perform the tasks that they want and need to do. Occupational Therapists (OTs) enable people who have physical, psychological, spiritual or cognitive difficulties, because of an illness, injury, or developmental challenge, live as independently and fully as possible.

What do Occupational Therapists do?

1. Tackle everyday challenges - We help people address difficulties they may have in tasks such as getting dressed, bathing, cooking or even using a computer- safely and as independently as possible.
2. Turn daily activities into therapy - OTs use meaningful “occupations” — like painting, cooking, sports, or play — as tools for healing. These activities help people grow physically, mentally, and emotionally while staying motivated and connected to their families and communities.
3. Support recovery and independence - After an accident, surgery, or illness, OTs guide people to regain strength, balance, and coordination so they can return to their daily routines.
4. Provide the right tools and adaptations - When someone struggles to perform a task in the usual way, OTs suggest creative solutions and adaptive devices — such as dressing aids, long-handled reachers, adaptive utensils, typing aids, etc - that make life easier.
5. Support mental health - OTs work with people facing anxiety, depression, trauma or stress, helping them regain focus, structure, and meaning in daily life.
6. Support for all ages - OTs work with all age groups from infancy through adolescents and the elderly. In children, OTs help with learning to play, write, or interact with others. For teenagers and young adults, therapy involves building study skills, time management, or emotional balance.
7. Encourage participation in work and community - OTs help people return to work, plan their day efficiently, and make home and school environments more supportive and accessible by suggesting home and environmental modifications.

Which areas of the hospital do Occupational Therapists work in?

Neurology - OTs work in various settings in the hospital with persons who suffer from various neurological conditions- the acute care settings in the Neurology and PMR department, long term rehabilitation at the Rehabilitation Institute, and various departments such as Geriatrics, Haematology, Oncology and Palliative care. OTs also attend clinics such as the Ergonomics and Back pain clinic, Memory clinic, Stroke and Head injury clinics etc.

Mental Health - OTs work with children, adolescents and adults with various mental health difficulties.

Paediatrics - OTs work in various specialised paediatric areas such as at Developmental Paediatrics, Integrated Child Care Services, Neonatology, Oncology, Orthopaedics, Rheumatology and Surgery.

Community - OTs work in various community-based settings such as the Community Health and Development, the Low-Cost Effective Care Unit, and perform home visits along with the Rehabilitation Team.

What does “Occupational Therapy in Action” mean?

This year’s theme highlights the heart of what Occupational Therapists do every day: **using creativity, problem-solving, and compassion** to help people live happier, healthier, and more meaningful lives. OT is about building **inclusive and supportive environments** — places where every individual is valued, respected, and empowered to contribute to the well-being of others. It’s not just about treatment; it’s about **helping people live life to its fullest potential**.
