Bidding Adieu to the CVJ Master – Dr. Baylis Vivek Joseph (BVJ)



On November 8th, 2025, we bid farewell to Dr. Baylis Vivek Joseph, our dearly beloved Professor of Neurosurgery, after 24 years of exemplary academic and clinical work. We find ourselves reflecting not merely on the years he has spent in neurosurgery, but on the principles, the discipline, and the grace with which he has lived out his calling. His retirement marks the end of an era—one defined by steadfast scruples, unwavering dedication, and a standard of excellence that has shaped generations of neurosurgeons.

Dr. Joseph completed his schooling at Delhi Public School. He completed his MBBS from the prestigious AFMC (1983-88). During 1990-95, he received training for his FRCSI (Ireland). He joined CMC Vellore in 1995 as a Junior resident and went on to complete his Neurosurgery training (M.Ch) in 2001. He did his fellowship in general neurosurgery at the Royal Adelaide Hospital, Australia, in 2004. He went on to complete his spine fellowship at Toronto Western Hospital, Canada, in 2006.

From the earliest days of his training to the height of his professional journey, Dr. Joseph stood out for his painstakingly meticulous work ethic. For him, every millimetre mattered, every decision held weight, and every patient deserved nothing short of perfection. It is this disciplined pursuit of precision that transformed his operating room into a place of both art and science—a space where young surgeons learned that “good enough” could never be good enough.

Yet, behind that uncompromising insistence on excellence lay a teacher's heart. Many of us, his juniors, remember the initial sense of awe and occasional dread of presenting cases to him. He was, without question, a hard taskmaster. He demanded clarity, preparation, and that we give our very best each day. But as the months and years passed, we came to understand the more profound truth: his demanding nature was rooted not in harshness, but in an unwavering belief in our potential. He pushed us because he knew we could rise to the challenge. And because of him, we did.

What set Dr. Joseph apart was his extraordinary ability to create an environment where growth was both expected and nurtured. He never hesitated to give responsibility when he felt a trainee was ready, even if that trainee did not believe it yet. His confidence in our abilities became the foundation on which we built our own. Many of the surgeons who stand tall today owe their early steps—and their courage—to the steady hand that guided them and the constant gaze that expected more from them. He was instrumental in taking forward odontoid screw surgery, C1-2 trans articular surgeries, and starting the deep-brain stimulation surgery in our department.

Beyond the hospital and academic halls, he is remembered just as fondly for his warm humanity. A devout Christian, Dr. Joseph carried his faith with quiet dignity, drawing from it the compassion, humility, and resilience that marked every interaction. His counselling, whether at the bedside or during a quiet corridor conversation, carried wisdom far more profound than medical training. He reminded us, often without using words, that while we heal with our hands, we serve with our hearts.

He is also a family man, unwavering in his love and devotion to his family. Many of us saw firsthand how he balanced the demands of a challenging profession with the tenderness and commitment he had for his home. He was equally supported by his wife, Dr Lallu. His son, Dr. Meshal Akash Joseph, has completed his MBBS from CMC Vellore, daughter, Dr. Madhini Neesha, is pursuing MBBS at a private medical college, Tamil Nadu.

He is a perfect example of achieving a work-life balance, being a husband, father, and pillar of strength to those he loved most.

And in the midst of all this seriousness, all this discipline, there exists a delightful facet to his personality, his talent as a singer and guitarist. Whether at department gatherings or informal celebrations, his voice would fill the room with warmth and melody. Those who have heard him sing know that his music carried the same sincerity and depth that defined his professional life.

As we bid farewell to Dr. Vivek Joseph, we do so with deep gratitude. His legacy is etched not only in surgical outcomes and academic contributions but also in the character he shaped within us, the discipline he instilled, and the values he embodied every day he walked these corridors.

His retirement is not an end, but a continuation an opportunity for him to embrace new joys, new rhythms, and new time with his beloved family. For us, it is a gentle reminder that the most accurate measure of a teacher's life is not the years they serve, but the lives they transform.

Thank you, Sir, for everything—for your vision, your discipline, your kindness, your music, and your unwavering moral compass. We wish you joy, peace, and fulfilment in the years ahead. Your legacy will continue in every patient we treat, every surgery we perform, and every young mind we mentor.

Camp Inauguration: The camp was formally inaugurated on 17th November 2025 at the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus. The devotion and prayer was led by Rev. Deepak Gnanaprakash, Chaplain. Mrs. Nirmala Margaret. P, Principal, College of Nursing, Chittoor Campus, welcomed the gathering and introduced the Chief Guest, Mrs. Joyce Rajan, Former Medical Social Worker, CMC Vellore. In her address, she encouraged the camp organisers and the NSS volunteers to perform the social service activities wholeheartedly for the people in Gudipala village. The following activities were carried out by the NSS Volunteers from 17th to 23rd November 2025.

Village Health Survey: A health survey was conducted by the NSS volunteers to identify the proportion of antenatal women, postnatal mothers and the productive groups; the health problems of the community, their socio-economic status, and the nutritional status of the children.

School Health Programme: There were 22 school children from Govt. Elementary school and 12 children from Anganwadi, in Gudipala village screened for common health problems like malnutrition, anaemia, dental caries, eye infection and common cold. Health education on personal hygiene and hand washing techniques was delivered and importance of iron supplementation was emphasised.

Rally: An awareness rally on “National Epilepsy Day” was conducted in the village. Mr. John Wesley, M.Sc. Nursing Tutor gave an awareness talk on Epilepsy. The volunteers took a pledge to protect and respect people with epilepsy. Following which, Mr. Prakash, the Village elder, flagged off the Rally. The volunteers went around the village carrying placards with slogans promoting care for people with epilepsy and the prevention of epilepsy.

Cleaning Campaign and Tree Plantation: Focusing on the theme ‘No Plastics’, the NSS volunteers cleaned the streets in Gudipala village and cleared the plastic. On the same day, the NSS volunteers planted tree saplings around the elementary school in Gudipala village.

Health Education: Throughout the week, the NSS volunteers delivered awareness talks on dengue awareness, anaemia, personal hygiene, hand wash technique, dental hygiene, prevention and management of hypertension, diabetes, heart attack, substance abuse, well-balanced diet and cancer awareness. An expert talk on cancer awareness to women on the theme ‘Early detection Saves Lives’ was delivered by Mrs. Sophia J, Assistant Professor in Maternity Nursing. A social awareness talk on Women’s Empowerment was given by Mrs. Nirmala Margaret, Principal, to the women in Gudipala Village.

Health Camps: A general health camp and eye camp were organised in the village. Dr. Seben, Medicine Unit and a team from the Ophthalmology Unit from CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus offered consultation and referral services to the village residents. Medicines for diabetes and hypertension, and vitamin supplements were distributed to the villagers of Gudipala village during the camp. Around 50 villagers benefited from this camp.

Session on Fire Safety: A session on Fire safety and management was organised for the NSS volunteers. Mr. Niranjan Kumar, Fire Safety Officer and the team from the Fire Safety department, CMC Vellore. The team created awareness of fire safety measures and conducted a practical demonstration, which benefited the volunteers.

Social Games: Social games were conducted for the NSS Volunteers by Mr. Jefferson and Mrs. Suprijitha, Training Officers from the RUHSA department, CMC Vellore. Building interpersonal skills and understanding the community were the themes of the games. CSCR Foundation Day 2025

Programme Highlights

Overview of CSCR:
