Inauguration of the Multimorbidity Clinic under the Department of Medicine II



The Multimorbidity Clinic (MOC) was inaugurated within the department of medicine, unit-II, on 29th January 2026 in the general medicine outpatients' department, CMC Vellore, Town Campus. The inauguration was held in the medicine classroom and started with a prayer by Chaplain Ms. Saramma Kuruvilla.

Dr. Anuka Alena Abraham, Assistant Professor, Department of Medicine II, delivered the welcome address. Dr. Tina George, Professor, and Dr. Anna Paul, Associate Professor, Medicine II, gave a brief description of the services offered by this clinic. Dr. Vikram Mathews, Director, and Dr. I. Rajesh, Medical Superintendent, delivered the chief guest address. Dr. Hallel Reba, Assistant Professor, was the Master of Ceremony. This was followed by the formal inauguration of the out-patient clinic by the Director.

The inauguration was graced by Dr. Thambu David, Senior Professor and mentor, Medicine II, Dr. Sowmya Sathyendra, Associate Director (HR) and Head, Department of Medicine, heads of all medical units, other faculty from the Department of General Medicine, General Surgery, Orthopaedics, representatives from OPD nursing service, medical records department, and office staff. The Multimorbidity Clinic is dedicated to the optimisation of patients living with chronic disease, with particular focus on those preparing for planned procedures. The clinic hopes to improve through targeted evaluation, medication review, and proactive management of chronic illness, clinical outcomes, and patient experience while supporting safe and efficient care delivery. The service runs on Mondays and Thursdays in the Medicine OPD, OPD block 2nd floor, Town campus. We are grateful to God, and we extend our sincere appreciation to the Department of Medicine, Orthopaedics, Surgery, Anaesthesia, and the Hospital Administration for their valued support in establishing this clinic.

Celebrating 75 Years of Excellence: The Platinum Jubilee Alumni Meet of the Department of General Surgery



On February 6th and 7th, 2026, the Department of General Surgery proudly celebrated its Platinum Jubilee alumni meet, marking 75 years of outstanding dedication to training postgraduate surgeons. The event commenced with an invocation of blessings by Rev. Finney Alexander on the first day, followed by a formal introduction by Dr. Inian Samarsam, Head of the Department, emphasising the significance of this remarkable milestone. The department organised an engaging two-day Continuing Medical Education (CME) session that addressed critical issues in surgical training and the future of general surgery. The first session, moderated by Dr. M.J. Paul, explored *“The role of the general surgeon in the context of super-specialisation.”* This session highlighted the evolving responsibilities of general surgeons as they navigate the landscape of sub-specialisation.

A thought-provoking debate by Dr. Gayatri B and Dr. Cecil T Thomas, on the proposition, *“Social media is a legitimate tool for training postgraduates in surgery,”* showcased the increasing acceptance of social media as a supplemental training resource while also urging moderation and caution in its use. Dr. Asha Solomon highlighted the importance of surgical nursing using the key stone analogy. Dr. Mithun Raam shed light on essential topics such as burnout among surgical residents and professionals, offering strategies to overcome these challenges.



The discussions on career opportunities for general surgeons in diverse sectors, including mission hospital, corporate and international arenas, were expertly presented by Dr. Arpit Mathew, Dr. Sanjay Govil, and Dr. Ajith John George. The highlight of the first day was a panel discussion led by Dr. Rajat Raghunath titled “*surgical training in CMC: lessons from the past and path for the future,*” which addressed several contemporary challenges in surgical training. The day concluded with a delightful gala dinner at Hibis Resort, featuring lively games, music performed by registrars, and a sumptuous feast that fostered camaraderie among attendees. The second day began with a heartfelt thanksgiving service, during which the department was rededicated. Dr. John Christo delivered a powerful message that resonated deeply with the gathering. The solemnity of the service was complemented by a moving choir performance, conducted by Dr. Samuel Paul Dhinakar, featuring registrars, consultants, and surgical nurses.



The meet concluded with a session focused on leadership, where Dr. Deepak Abraham Thomas and Dr. Suviraj John shared their insights and experiences in leadership roles. The event culminated in honoring all former Heads of the Department of General Surgery and enjoyed a quintessential Vellore biryani lunch. The celebration brought together 150 alumni from across the globe, underscoring the strong and enduring bonds forged within our surgical community.

This memorable occasion not only celebrated the rich history and contributions of the department but also paved the way for future advancements in surgical training and practice.

Workshop on databases and data management organised by the Clinical Epidemiology Unit



The Clinical Epidemiology Unit organised a two-day workshop on databases and data management for beginners between February 3rd and 4th, 2026, at LCEU, CMC Vellore. The workshop had 20 participants who were faculty and postgraduate students from our institution. The topics covered were research question, study designs, data and its types, Clinical Research Form (CRF), data dictionary, principles of data management, overview of online data collection soft wares, practical sessions on Epidata software and online database creation and PSPP software.

The participants had hands-on sessions with each of the above softwares taking them through the steps of creating a CRF and performing basic statistical analysis. The faculty consisted of Dr. Thambu David, Senior Professor, Department of Medicine and Clinical Epidemiology Unit (CEU), Dr. Vignesh Kumar Chandiraseharan, Professor and Co-ordinator, CEU, Mr. Madhan Kumar, Computer operator, CEU, & Mr. Fredrick Raj, CEU. College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus & Chittoor Cancer Unit-World Cancer Day 2026

World Cancer Day is observed every year on 4th February to create awareness on prevention, early detection and appropriate treatment among the general population. In alignment with the global and national mission, the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus, and Chittoor Cancer unit hosted cancer awareness programmes from February 2nd to February 5th, 2026. Below is a detailed description of activities organised around the theme “United by Unique”.



February 2, 2026: A health talk on oral cancer was delivered by Dr. Cheryl Lydia John, Assistant Physician, Community Health Unit, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus, to the patients, their relatives, staff and students in the waiting area. She highlighted the risk factors and lifestyle modification to prevent Oral Cancers.

February 3, 2026: A health talk on skin cancer by Dr. Hannah Alice Abraham, Senior Resident, Dermatology Unit, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus and a health talk on head and neck cancers by Dr. Roween Eunice Niveditha, Senior Resident, Chittoor ENT Unit, were delivered to patients and patients' relatives gathered in the outpatient waiting area. Their talk enlightened the target audience on the causes and prevention of skin cancer and head and neck cancer. On the same day, an oral cancer screening camp was organised in Kattakinda Palli village, Chittoor district. The camp commenced with prayer, followed by health education on oral cancer by VII semester B.Sc. (N) students of the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus. Dr. Ajish George Oommen, Assistant Surgeon, Dental unit, CMC Vellore, Chittoor campus, screened the village residents for oral cancer. Among the 50 patients screened, two patients were referred to CMC Vellore, Chittoor cancer unit, one with palatine cancer and another with a pre-cancerous lesion.

February 4, 2026: A health talk on breast cancer and healthy lifestyle practices to prevent cancer was delivered by Dr. Patricia, Professor, and Dr. Tarun, Assistant Professor from the Department of Radiation Oncology Unit III, CMC Vellore, to patients and their relatives gathered in the outpatient waiting area, CMC Vellore, Chittoor campus. She conducted an interactive session on the importance of early detection, regular screenings and a healthy lifestyle in which the audience actively participated. Mrs. Leena, breast care nurse educator, CMC Vellore, set up a stall on breast cancer awareness and displayed posters on self-breast examination and models of breast cancer. Informational brochures on self-breast examination were distributed to patients and their relatives.



February 5, 2026: A cancer awareness programme was organised in the outpatient waiting area, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus at 9 am. The programme commenced with a prayer by Rev. Deepak, Chaplain, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus, followed by a prayer song by BSc nursing interns. Dr. Gautam Waran, Assistant Professor, Chittoor Cancer Unit, welcomed the gathering, followed by the chief guest address by Dr. Ajoy Oommen John, Associate Physician in Medical Oncology, CMC Vellore and felicitation by Dr. Reginald Alex, Medical Superintendent and Dr. Pastin Pushpa Rani, Vice Principal, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus.

Dr. Ajoy Oommen appreciated the efforts to raise awareness among the general public about various cancers and their early detection and treatment. He also reiterated the theme for the year 2026 - 'United by Unique' and highlighted the importance of staying united to create a world where we look beyond the disease and emphasised that every patient's experience with cancer is unique. A mime was performed by a B.Sc. N interns on risk factors, causes, signs and symptoms and prevention of cancer. The programme came to an end with a vote of thanks by Mrs. Annie Elizabeth T, MSc N Tutor, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus and a closing prayer by Rev. Ajay, Chaplain.

As a part of the cancer awareness programme, a poster competition on the theme 'cancer awareness' was conducted for staff and students. Ms. Ashly Sabu, IV-year B.Sc.(N) student, bagged the first prize, Ms. Jasper Jessica P, III-year B.Sc.(N) student won second prize, and Ms. Sharon Christy, II-year B.Sc.(N) student won the third prize in the poster competition. 
