Rev. Dr. Finney Alexander, Head of Chaplaincy, delivered the sermon on the theme “The Everlasting Arms.” He invited the gathering into a moment of deep reflection, drawing from powerful and reassuring Biblical passages:

“The eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms.”, Deuteronomy 33:27

He spoke on the significance of leadership, reflecting on how the absence of leadership can lead to a loss of direction, discipline, and growth within an institution. He emphasised that leadership is not merely a position, but a spiritual calling, an ordinary individual chosen and transformed by God to serve as a leader. Quoting Scripture, he reminded the congregation: *“Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you, before you were born I set you apart.” Jeremiah 1:5*

Leadership, he noted, is a gift; a calling akin to a helmsman guiding a ship with wisdom, humility, and purpose.

The Commissioning

The commissioning service was led by Rt. Rev. H. Sharma Nithiyandham, Bishop of the CSI Vellore Diocese. Drawing from the image of the Good Shepherd, he reflected on the calling of a leader to serve, to guide, and to truly know the people while being known by them.

He then led Dr. Biju George, Director-Designate, through a solemn litany of affirmation. His heartfelt responses resonated with sincerity and conviction, reflecting both the depth of his commitment and the promise of his leadership.

The Bishop also led the service and celebrated the Holy Communion, adding to the spiritual significance of the occasion.

Director's Community Update and Handing Over



The Director's Community Update and Handing Over Programme was held on Friday, 13th March 2026, at the Scudder Auditorium. The programme began with an invocation hymn beautifully rendered by the College Choir, followed by the opening prayer by Rev. Dr. Finney Alexander, Head of Chaplaincy, setting a tone of thanksgiving and reflection.

Dr. Sunil Anand, Vice Chair of the CMC Vellore Association, delivered the welcome address, inviting the audience to celebrate God's goodness reflected in the exceptional leadership of Dr. Vikram Mathews, the transition to Dr. Biju George, and God's continuing hope and faithfulness.

Dr. Vikram Mathews, Director, CMC Vellore began by expressing deep gratitude to the Council and acknowledging the unwavering support of the staff throughout his tenure. He reflected on key aspects of his leadership, including infrastructure development, financial stewardship, and the growth of various campuses. He also highlighted innovations and advancements across the institution, offering a clear perspective on operational priorities and responsible financial management going forward.

He highlighted the dangers of the increasing corporatisation of medical care, underscoring the importance of remaining competitive while remaining true to the institution's mission.



In addressing these challenges, he urged senior staff to take a proactive role in mentoring and guiding new staff and students, ensuring that the institution’s core values and culture are preserved and strengthened. He then formally welcomed Dr. George as the incoming Director, highlighting his clinical expertise and leadership qualities. This was followed by the symbolic presentation of the Holy Bible and the Constitution and by-laws of CMC Vellore, signifying the transition of leadership and a continued commitment to the institution’s mission and values. Dr. Mathews concluded his address with a quote from the Book of Lamentations: *“The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; His mercies never come to an end.”*

In response, Dr. George expressed that he was honoured to lead a community marked by integrity, compassion, and faith. He reaffirmed his commitment to delivering quality healthcare, with a focus on consolidation, strengthening the mission network, and fostering innovation.

Ms. Anuvinda Varkey, Chairperson of the CMC Vellore Association, delivered the closing remarks, stating: “The true measure of our work is Christ-centeredness, not just advances in medicine, but the lives we touch with dignity and hope”. She emphasised that compassion is what transforms medical service into a healing ministry.

Dr. Vinod Joseph Abraham, PI of the PEP Project, gave an overview of the project; Dr. Biju George, Director Designate, unveiled the CIE plaque, and Dr. Solomon Sathishkumar, Principal, formally opened the Centre.

The increasing importance of educational innovation in preparing health professionals for complex and rapidly changing healthcare environments was highlighted. The event concluded with a vote of thanks by the Co-PI of the PEP Project, Dr. Rebekah Dass Zechariah.



ClinViCON 2026 2nd Annual Clinical Virology Conference



5th – 7th February 2026 | Scudder Auditorium, Bagayam, CMC Vellore

The ClinViCON 2026 – 2nd Annual Clinical Virology Conference, conducted under the aegis of the Indian Society for Clinical Virology (ISCV), was held from 5th – 7th February 2026 at the Scudder Auditorium, Christian Medical College (CMC), Vellore, with the theme “Integrating Virology and Clinical Care for a Healthier Future.” The conference brought together virologists, clinicians, researchers, academicians, and postgraduate scholars from across India and abroad, providing a valuable platform for academic exchange and collaboration in Clinical Virology.

The conference commenced with an inaugural ceremony, which included a special recorded message from Dr. Rajiv Bahl, Director General of ICMR, who emphasised the importance of robust surveillance systems and a One Health approach for effective outbreak preparedness and global health security. The occasion also featured the felicitation of Dr. T. Jacob John for his pioneering contributions to infectious diseases and public health in India. A tribute was also paid to Dr. G. Sridharan, recognising his significant contributions to virology and his lasting influence as a teacher and mentor.



The three-day scientific programme included plenary lectures, panel discussions, oral presentations, poster sessions, and an academic quiz. The sessions addressed key areas such as advances in viral diagnostics, surveillance strategies, immunopathogenesis, vaccine development, and the integration of molecular diagnostics into clinical practice.



A total of 211 participants registered for the conference, with 74 faculty members from across the country, including 20 faculty from CMC, who contributed as speakers and session chairs across nine thematic scientific sessions.

Young researchers and postgraduate students actively participated by presenting their research work, reflecting the growing strength of virology research in the country.

One of the highlights of the conference was the Presidential Oration delivered by Dr. Amita Jain, President of the ISCV, who discussed the evolving landscape of Clinical Virology in India and emphasized the need to strengthen laboratory capacity and quality diagnostic services. The prestigious 15th Fieldhouse Myers Oration was delivered during the conference by Dr. Kanta Subbarao, Université Laval, Canada, who spoke on pandemic preparedness and future respiratory virus threats, drawing on extensive international research experience.

Awards were presented for best oral presentations, best poster presentations, and the quiz competition, recognising scientific merit and excellence among participants. The academic activity was accredited and awarded 30 credit points by the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R Medical University. The feedback from participants was highly encouraging, highlighting the excellent academic content, effective organisation, and the simplicity with which the conference was conducted in Vellore despite the challenges of connectivity. The ClinViCON 2026 promoted scientific exchange, collaboration, and advancement in the field of Clinical Virology, while providing an enriching academic experience for all delegates.

Workshop on Systematic Review of Health Economic Evidence Synthesis

CMC's Health Economics and Technology Assessment Group (CHEETA), Centre for Public Health, conducted a workshop on "Systematic Review on Economic Evidence" on February 7, 2026. The session was led by Prof (Dr) Denny John, an eminent expert in health economics and Chair of the ISPOR India Network, Senior Fellow at IHEETS, Kerala, and Adjunct Professor at the School of Public Health, University of Adelaide, Australia.



The hands-on workshop focused on evidence synthesis from economic evaluations, equipping participants with practical tools and methodologies. Chairing the session, Dr K. R. John emphasised the growing importance of generating economic data to strengthen health research and decision-making. During his visit, Dr. Denny delivered multiple lectures to share his expertise in health economics and health technology assessment. At CMC's Ranipet campus, he conducted a session on "Health Economics for Clinicians", introducing participants to foundational concepts using real-world examples. Another session, held at the Town Campus, addressed "Hospital-based Health Technology Assessment", where he discussed approaches to evaluating new technologies and how CMC could develop an institutional HTA framework tailored to its values and needs. He also supported a health economics methodology clinic with the MAL-ED study under Developmental Paediatrics.

As part of the visit, the CHEETA core team also held its strategic planning meeting on February 6, 2026. The meeting was led by Dr. Tarun K. George and attended by senior faculty and representatives from various departments, including Prof. Vinay Oommen (Medical Education), Dr. K. R. John (former Director, CHAD), Dr. Denny John, Rekha K (Biostatistics), Varshini Neethi Mohan (PhD Scholar IIT Madras), Jainy John (Internal Audit), Asha Solomon (College of Nursing), Dr. Bina Koshy (Developmental Paediatrics), Dr. Anu Oommen (CHAD), and Dr. Reshma Raju (Independent researcher). The team discussed key priorities and outlined the way forward for strengthening CHEETA's initiatives in health economics and technology assessment across the institution.

The Short course 'On Chemotherapy', for nurses

The Departments of Haemato- oncology Nursing, along with the Continuing Professional Advancement & Blended Learning Cell, College of Nursing, CMC, conducted the 8th batch of the short course in Chemotherapy for nurses between February 9th and March 8th 2026. This is a 4-week, onsite programme, blended with theory and clinical learning. It consists of 4 modules with an evaluation at the end of each module.



A total of 4 trainees underwent the programme, 2 trainees from Gudalur Adivasi hospital, Nilgiris and 2 from CMC Vellore.

This short course is designed to prepare registered nurses with specialised knowledge, skills, and competence in providing Chemotherapy to patients battling cancer. It also aims to equip them to educate, train, and counsel patients and caregivers on various aspects of Chemotherapy. We do appreciate the commitment and contributions of the Departments of Haematology and Medical Oncology in the successful completion of the course. The trainees expressed a high level of satisfaction with the course.

World Sleep Day 2026 Celebrations at CMC Vellore



The Department of Respiratory Medicine at CMC Vellore marked World Sleep Day 2026 with a series of initiatives aimed at promoting awareness about healthy sleep and sleep disorders among both healthcare professionals and the general public. The celebrations commenced with a community awareness programme on Thursday, 12th March 2026, held near the Old CPU building at the Vellore Main Campus.

The programme was inaugurated by Dr. David Mathew, Deputy Medical Superintendent; Dr. Binila Chacko, Deputy Director; Mrs. Annie Jerome, Associate Nursing Superintendent; and Dr. Richa Gupta, Professor and Head of the Department of Respiratory Medicine.

Obituaries

- **Dr. Lilian Kamali Jeyaseelan**, a member of the CMC Batch of 1961, passed away on 11 February 2026 at the age of 81. She was born on 9 May 1944 in Nagapattinam, Tamil Nadu, the second child of Mr Peter Paul Pandian and Mrs Hepzibah Paul Pandian. She received her early education at St Ignatius Convent School in Palayamkottai and later continued her schooling in Coimbatore. In 1961 she entered Christian Medical College, Vellore, to pursue her medical studies. After graduating, she began her medical career as a Medical Officer at the Mission Hospital in Erode.



In 1971 she married Dr A. D. K. Jeyaseelan and moved to his hometown of Nazareth in Tirunelveli District, Tamil Nadu. On 18 September 1971 she joined St Luke's Hospital as a Medical Evangelist. Within a year, her dedication and leadership were recognized when she was appointed Medical Superintendent of St. Luke's Hospital and became the leader of the Tirunelveli Diocesan Medical Services. Dr. Kamali devoted the entirety of her professional life—spanning three decades—to the development of St Luke's Hospital. Under her able leadership, the hospital grew from a modest institution into a modern multispecialty medical centre serving the surrounding communities.

One of her earliest initiatives was the renovation and expansion of the hospital. Two new operation theatres and a surgical ward were added, significantly strengthening the hospital's surgical capabilities. With these improved facilities, she was able to attract specialist surgeons to serve at the hospital. She also modernised the diagnostic services by upgrading the X-ray equipment and introducing additional facilities, including an ultrasound scanner. Her vision extended beyond general medical services. She established a separate ophthalmology unit and later added a dental clinic to broaden the range of care available to patients. Recognizing the need for trained support staff, she founded a training centre for paramedical workers and nurse-aides, helping to meet the growing demands of the expanding hospital. She also initiated the process of establishing a nursing college within the Diocesan Medical Services—a dream that later became a reality and stands today as a testament to her commitment to education and professional development. Dr. Kamali was a highly skilled and dedicated obstetrician. According to hospital records, she conducted more than 10,000 deliveries during her career. Despite the demands of her work—including nights spent performing emergency Caesarean sections—she remained steadfast in her spiritual discipline, never missing the daily 7:00 a.m. chapel service. Her quiet faith, tireless dedication, and unwavering commitment made her a deeply respected role model to her junior colleagues and hospital staff.

She cared deeply for the welfare of the hospital staff, treating them as members of her extended family. She introduced a gratuity programme for employees and ensured that whenever government wages were revised, the hospital staff received corresponding increases without delay. She also organised annual staff tours, fostering a sense of community and appreciation among the team. Dr. Kamali is remembered as a gentle, soft-spoken, and compassionate physician who treated every patient with empathy and genuine concern. She rarely raised her voice, yet maintained discipline and respect through the quiet strength of her own example. She was awarded the 25 Year Meritorious service award for her service in mission hospitals in the year 1999. She is survived by her husband, Dr. A. D. K. Jeyaseelan, her daughters Kavitha and Divya, and their families.

Her life of service, faith, and compassion will remain an enduring inspiration to all who knew her.

- **Mr. Shishram Singh**, father of Dr. Gurbind Singh, Scientist D, Centre for Stem Cell Research, passed away on 13th March, 2026. Let us uphold all the bereaved family members in our prayers.
- **Dr. K.V. Johnny**, passed away on Saturday, the 14th of March 2026, in Kochi, Kerala. Dr Johnny was among the earliest pioneers in nephrology in India, having been recognised as a specialist in Nephrology by Madras University. An alumnus from Trivandrum Medical College, joined CMC in 1965 under the leadership of Dr P. Koshy. For the 11 years of service in CMC (1965-1976), Dr Johnny had said: “The very first reflection of my personal life is, it is ONLY CMC that blessed me with a real professional career in the field of Medicine”. A vision envisaged by Dr P. Koshy, Dr Johnny, along with Dr J S M Shastry, they established the department of Nephrology in Christian Medical College, Vellore, in January 1971. Dr Johnny played a pivotal role in shaping kidney care and transplant medicine in India. In February 1971, along with Dr Mohan Rao and team, they performed the country’s first kidney transplant surgery. He was also instrumental in establishing one of India’s largest dialysis centres in CMC and the DM nephrology training program in 1974, the 2nd of its kind in the country. The Department of Nephrology, CMC Vellore, remembers Dr Johnny with gratitude in leadership. He is survived by his wife, Dr Molly Johnny, Head of the Department of Microbiology at VPS Lakeshore Hospital, Kochi, their children: Dr Vino Jose Varghese (USA), Dr Anil John Mani (USA), and Dr Asha Vikas (UK). The funeral service will be held on 18th March, at the Orthodox Church, Thevara, Kochi, Kerala.

A tribute to Dr. K. V. Johnny, A Pioneer in Nephrology and Renal Transplantation in India.

Dr. K.V. Johnny, an eminent physician, pioneering nephrologist, and distinguished teacher, passed away on 14th March 2026, leaving behind a remarkable legacy in the field of medicine. His life was a testament to dedication, innovation, and compassionate service to patients and students alike. Dr. Johnny often reflected that it was his time at the Christian Medical College Vellore that shaped his true professional destiny. After completing his MD from Trivandrum Medical College, he joined CMC in 1965 under the inspiring leadership of the renowned Dr. P. Koshy. The eleven years he spent at CMC, from 1965 to 1976, became the most productive and defining period of his professional life. Recognizing his exceptional potential, CMC selected Dr. Johnny for advanced training in Nephrology and Renal Transplantation in Adelaide, Australia (1967–1969). Along with his close colleague and dear friend Dr. Mohan Rao, he trained under the distinguished physicians Dr. Jim Lawrence and Dr. Peter Knight, gaining invaluable expertise in the emerging field of kidney medicine.

Upon returning to India, Dr. Johny and Dr. Mohan Rao made medical history. On 02.02.1971, they performed one of the earliest successful **kidney transplants in India** at CMC on **Mr. Shanmugam**, a patient suffering from end-stage renal disease due to Adult Polycystic Kidney Disease. At a time when medical facilities were limited, this achievement required extraordinary determination and courage. Essential resources were scarce — donor kidneys had to be manually washed and perfused, and modern immunosuppressive medications such as azathioprine and parenteral steroids were not readily available. Despite these challenges, their pioneering work laid the foundation for the future of renal transplantation in India.

Dr. Johny's contributions to medicine were profound and far-reaching. During his tenure at CMC, he:

- Became one of the earliest pioneers of nephrology in India, formally recognised as a nephrology specialist by Madras University.
- Established the Nephrology Super-Speciality (DM) training programme, the second such programme in India, helping train future generations of nephrologists.
- Headed the medical team involved in India's early kidney transplantation efforts, marking a historic milestone in Indian medical practice.
- Developed a large and modern Renal Dialysis Centre at CMC, an achievement that drew national recognition and was visited by Prime Minister Mrs. Indira Gandhi.
- Published pioneering research in nephrology, contributing to the growth of the speciality in India.

Beyond his academic and clinical achievements, Dr. Johny was deeply respected for his humility, mentorship, and dedication to patient care. He inspired countless students and colleagues, many of whom later became leaders in medicine. His passing marks the end of an era, but his contributions will continue to live on through the institutions he strengthened, the programmes he founded, and the many lives he touched. Dr. K. V. Johny will always be remembered as a visionary physician, a pioneer of nephrology in India, and a compassionate healer whose legacy will endure for generations..


