Playing the Long Game The Role of Philanthropy in Institution Building

21 March 2026 | Bangalore International Centre, Bengaluru

The Shifting Landscape

On the evening of 21 March 2026, the Ajit Isaac Foundation along with CMC Vellore and Sattva Consulting convened a curated gathering of India's leading philanthropists, institutional leaders, and change-makers at the Bangalore International Centre. Titled *Playing the Long Game: The Role of Philanthropy in Institution Building*, the gathering brought together over 50 philanthropists and leaders to explore a one question: what will it take for India's institutions to shape the next century of national progress? The evening was anchored in a clear thesis: India has historically been built by visionary private giving. From the Tata Memorial Centre to CMC Vellore, it is institutions built on long-horizon philanthropy that have delivered the most enduring social impact.

Data & Trends: The Changing Face of Indian Philanthropy

Key insights shared included:

- India has climbed from 81st to 38th on the Global Innovation Index in a decade - a rise directly linked to the strength of its research and teaching institutions.
- India has approximately 13,000 ultra-high-net-worth families with net worth above US\$30 million, yet, giving as a percentage of wealth remains below 0.15%.
- An estimated ₹45,000 Cr is now spent annually through CSR mandates, yet systemic underspending persists - and very little flows toward endowment-style, long-term institution building.

Voices from the Room

Dr. Biju George, Director of CMC Vellore, presented a compelling case study on what institution-building philanthropy looks like in practice. He spoke about how an act of philanthropy in 1900 by an American banker enabled Dr. Ida Scudder to establish the Mary Taber Schell Hospital, which became the seed institution for what would grow into CMC Vellore. Today, CMC Vellore has evolved into one of India's most respected and trusted healthcare institutions. It is currently ranked #1 among private multispecialty hospitals in India and #3 among medical colleges nationally, according to the Ministry of Education's NIRF rankings.

DID YOU KNOW?

Dr. Stanley John (1932–2020), a pioneer of cardiothoracic surgery at CMC Vellore assisted in India's first open-heart surgery, performed the nation's first repairs of complex congenital heart defects, and remarkably holds the world record for over 5,300 closed mitral valvotomy procedures.

CMC Vellore has also been an engine of medical breakthroughs that changed the course of Indian healthcare - from Dr. Paul Brand's pioneering work in leprosy rehabilitation to Dr. Gagandeep Kang's development of Rotavac, India's first indigenously developed rotavirus vaccine. Today, CMC continues to advance frontier research in CAR-T cell therapy, robotic surgery, integrated cancer care, and AI-enabled diagnostics. CMC currently gives back over ₹500 Cr per year through subsidised care, scholarships, and community health outreach - demonstrating a 'Both-And' model where institutional excellence and social equity are not trade-offs, but complements. The CMC Model represents something rare: an institution that has sustained excellence and equity across 126 years, serving patients from 30+ countries - entirely without pursuing commercial profit. Its growth and impact are a direct argument for what purposeful, long-term philanthropy can achieve.

Playing the Long Game | Chat with Matthew Hayden- Endurance and Patience: Lessons from Matthew Hayden

The evening closed with a fireside chat with cricketer Matthew Hayden, who drew a powerful parallel between the discipline of cricket and the discipline of institution-building philanthropy. He spoke about the patience required to build something that outlasts an individual innings - whether on the field or in the field of social impact. The analogy resonated deeply with the audience of philanthropists and leaders. Hayden's framing - that endurance, not brilliance alone, is what distinguishes great legacies - gave philanthropists in the room a personal vocabulary for the kind of patient capital that CMC's story exemplifies.

Call to Action | Next Steps- Committing to Action: What Comes Next

The evening concluded with a clear and compelling call to action by Dr. Dheepak Selvaraj, Associate Director, Ranipet Campus. He also expressed his gratitude to the CMC team; Dr.Lallu Joseph, Associate General Superintendent, Dr. Sneha Varki, Head of Paediatrics; Dr. Selvamani, Associate Director, Finance; Shika Bhattacharji, Development Office; and Sunitha Serena, Office of Communications for their efforts in making the event a success. Attendees were invited to commit to a two-day immersion visit to CMC Vellore, designed to offer potential donors a first-hand experience of the institution's scale, mission, and the specific areas where philanthropic partnership can make the greatest impact.



Biomedical Equipment Maintenance Certification Scheme (BEMCS)



Biomedical Engineering, CMC Vellore has been awarded the Biomedical Equipment Maintenance Certification Scheme (BEMCS), after a 5 days intensive audit by KCS – KIHT Certification Services, a Government of India project supported by the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology under Andhra Pradesh MedTech Zone (AMTZ), Vizag. The BEMCS scheme is developed in compliance with the International Standard ISO/IEC 17065:2012 for conformity assessment, certifying that BME meets the requirements for Equipment Preventive Maintenance and aligns with international best practices. The BEMCS certification was awarded to Biomedical Engineering at the 10th Edition of CAHOCON 2026, which was also the 1st regional conference of ISQUA for South Asia by Dr. Shyama Nagarajan, Executive Director, Make in India Hospitals (MIIH), AMTZ and Mr. Uday Baskar, Certification Manager, KCS, AMTZ.

CMC Vellore is the 2nd institution in India and globally to adopt and achieve certification under the BEMCS scheme. This recognition covers approximately 6,500 biomedical equipment, all of which are fully maintained and managed in-house by the CMC Biomedical Engineering Department. This achievement reflects the Biomedical Engineering Department's commitment to ensuring optimal performance of biomedical equipment, reducing risks associated with equipment failure, and enhancing patient safety and quality of care. The staff of Biomedical Engineering department are very grateful to the Almighty, CMC Administration and all the end user departments for their unwavering support and encouragement in achieving this milestone.

CME on Occupational Health: Diagnosis and Management of Common Occupational Diseases in Primary Care

The Occupational Health Team and Department of Continuing Medical Education organised a CME on Occupational Health: Diagnosis and Management of Common Occupational Diseases in Primary Care on 18th April, 2026. The programme was moderated by Dr. Reginald G. Alex, Professor Department of Emergency Medicine, Chittoor Campus. The resource persons, Dr. Krupa George and Dr. Mohan Jambugulam, Department of Medicine, Dr. Barney Isaac, Department of Pulmonary Medicine, Dr. Priya Kuryan, Department of Dermatology, Dr. Manu Mathew Kurien and Ms. Delicia Roshini, Department of PMR, and Dr. R. Kailasam, Chief Medical Officer, Vedanta Limited, Tuticorin; discussed approach to occupational diseases, general principles of occupational toxicology, approach to occupational lung disease, diagnosis and management of common Occupational skin diseases, work-related musculoskeletal diseases, exercise strategies for occupational health, and changing scenario of occupational health, including legal aspects of occupational health. Ms. Delicia Roshini and Mr. Prince Jehoash from the Department of PMR demonstrated effective exercise techniques to improve posture, flexibility, strength etc., The programme was attended by over 203 participants from 14 states and several departments in CMC. The CME Department thanks Dr. Reginald G. Alex, Dr. Krupa George, all the faculty, and Telemedicine Department, for making the CME possible.

CME on Critical Care Management of Trauma- Trauma 360

The Department of Critical Care Medicine successfully conducted a one-day Continuing Medical Education (CME) programme, *Trauma 360*, on 18th April. The event offered a comprehensive academic update on trauma care, spanning core resuscitation principles to the latest advances in trauma critical care. It attracted participation from over 80 delegates across the country and was additionally attended by more than 25 participants online via Zoom. The CME featured distinguished faculty, including Rajiv Gupta from Harvard Medical School, an expert in advanced radiodiagnostic technologies in neurosciences, who delivered an insightful talk on their applications in neurotrauma. Additionally, experts from the institute covered diverse aspects of trauma care, providing a holistic perspective on acute and critical management. A series of hands-on workshops formed a key highlight of the program and were highly appreciated by participants. These sessions focused on practical bedside skills, including pericardiocentesis, bronchoscopy, nerve blocks, primary and secondary survey, and neurosonology. The programme was accredited by the Tamil Nadu Medical Council with 10 credit points. The CME was conducted in commemoration of the superannuation of Dr. Mathew Joseph, marking the occasion with a meaningful academic tribute.



Clinical Epidemiology Unit organised the Institutional Epidemiology Workshop

The Clinical Epidemiology Unit, CEU organised the 3-day Institutional Epidemiology Workshop for DM/MCh candidates in two batches on behalf of the Principal's office. The workshop for the second batch was held at the New Examination Hall between 15th and 17th April, 2026. The workshop was attended by 59 first-year DM/MCh registrars from all specialities and 63 Post-doctoral fellowship students. The workshop started with a prayer by Chaplain Mrs. Janospher Pricilla and a welcome address by Dr. Vignesh Kumar, Coordinator, CEU, CMC. The participants were given individual attention during the hands-on session. This is a part of ongoing annual activity coordinated by the Clinical Epidemiology Unit. The workshop received a positive feedback from the participants.



Safe Motherhood Day celebration 2026 OBG Department, CMC Vellore

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at Christian Medical College Vellore commemorated Safe Motherhood Day 2026 under the theme “Equity in Maternal Health Care: Leaving No Mother Behind.” The celebration brought together faculty, students, and staff in a collective effort to promote safe, accessible, and equitable maternal healthcare.

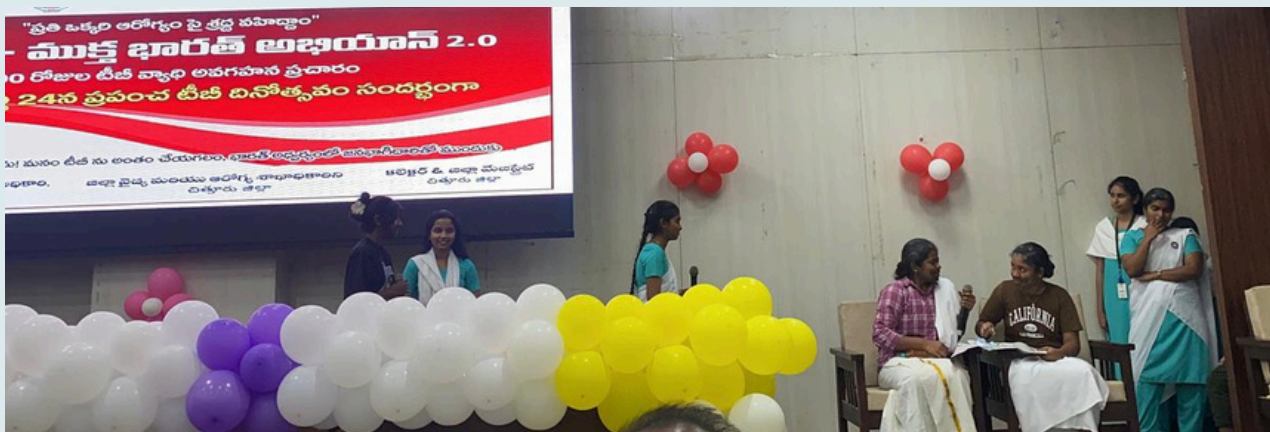
The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from delegates across the country and across the borders along with internal trainees, fostering a rich academic exchange.
